

The Last will and Testament, of Polly Denton deceased was Exhibited in open Court at May Term 1833 and Proven by the oath of Jonathan Taylor & Frank Denton subscribing witnesses thereto Enoch Dale one of the Exors therein named Qualified & Recorded

In the name of God Amen I Polly Denton of the County of Currituck being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this 4th day of May in the year of our Lord 1833 Make and publish this my Last will & Testament in manner following that is to say

First I give and bequeath to my son Levin Denton the tract of land whereon I now live on Churches Island bounded as follows beginning at the sound side at Martin Jarvis line thence Northerly, bounding said Jarvis line to the Back line thence Southerly to the Land belonging to Nathan Walker's heirs Land thence Eastwardly bounding said line to the sound side thence Northwardly bounding said sound to the first station containing 62 1/2 acres be the same more or less also one piece of Land on Piney Island that my husband Levin Denton de'd give me to him & his heirs for ever -

I give and bequeath to my son Levin Denton one negro woman named Woodget to him and his heirs

I give and bequeath to my son Lewis W. Denton one negro girl named Hedney to him and his heirs -

Item I leave all the remainder of my Estate both as to this done and with to be Equally divided between Sobrena Payne Lewis W. Denton David Denton Alexandria Denton and my grand son Levin Ballance to them and their heirs for ever -

And I hereby make and ordain my worthy Friends Lewis W. Denton & Enoch Dale Executors of this my last & Testament, in witness whereof I the said Polly Denton have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written

The Last will and Testament of Cynthia Boyer was Exhibited in open Court at August Term 1832 was Proven by the oath of John Brabble a witness thereto the Executor therein named Qualified and ordered to be Recorded S. Hall &c

In the name of God Amen I Cynthia Boyer of the County of Currituck State of North Carolina being very sick and weak but in sound mind and memory do make this my Last will & Testament at the same time utterly revoke all former wills made by me declaring this to be my last will & Testament -

First I give and bequeath one half of my whole farm now growing on the plantation to Wilson Coatts my son and one cow & two hogs and also I lend Nathan Coatts James & Alaman to lend the Crop with what crop is raised also I give to my daughter Sarah Coatts as much of the other half of the crop as will last her one year and the Balance of crop to Wilson Coatts also I give to Sarah Coatts one cow & two sheep & two hogs

also I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Coatts my Land lying at or near Comyock Bridge to him and his heirs forever. at the same time I do appoint my son Wilson Coatts my Executor of this my Last will & Testament to which I have here set my hand and seal this the 16th day of May 1832

The Last will and Testament of John Becham was Exhibited at August Term 1832 and proven by the oath of Thos B. Lewis a subscribing witness thereto the Executor Qualified and ordered to be recorded

In the name of God Amen I John Becham of Currituck County and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God do this the 10th day of May in the year of our Lord 1832 make and publish this my Last will and Testament in manner following that is to say

First I give to my daughter Mrs. Becham all my worts of Land on the Banks and one tin on Mr. Medcote Swins Marsh and 1 Cow and calf in any quarter first choiced

I Give to my Mother Betsy Beacham all my wille and portion of land on Susequater land and one head calf second choice and one steer on Susequater Island first choice one bear and furniture first choice also one chest an my gun to Barket Beacham.

I give my Mother Betsy Beacham all my stock of hogs on Susequater and 1 head and furniture second choice of skin Bayed one cow and calf 3 choice also one table first choice and one hand mill.

I give to my Sister Betsey Beacham one heifer I gave to her on Susequater about 3 years old at this time one chest and one lining wheel and one table 2 choice

I give to my Sister Nancy Beacham 1 loom 1 profal and furniture and one woller wheel and all the pot ware belonging to me now in possession of my mother and set off them

I also give to Love Hobbs and George Hobbs and Lemmy Hobbs three dollars among the 3 that is to say one dollar each to be paid to them by my Executor when he thinks proper

I also give the remainder of my property that is not mentioned before Equally to be divided between Tho Beacham and Barket Beacham and Bazel Beacham and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend and brother Tho Beacham Executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed my seal day and date before written
