I John Bowdoy, Vendor of the State of North Carolina and County of Currituck, being in a reasonable state of health and of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manners and form following, First of all my will is that after my decease all my just debts be paid by my executor hereafter named,

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Bowdy one dollar to him and his heirs forever

Now I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Briggs one cow
and apparel and one heffer to her and her heirs -

Then I give and bequeath unto my Love (James) Bowdoy the price
I and I bought of John Heath to him and his heirs

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Willoughby Lowdy
the piece or parcel of Land that fell to me by the death of
my Brother Gales Lowdy to him and his heirs. —

them I give ~~nothing~~ unto my wife Maria & my two
 kids and furniture to her and her heirs

Then I give unto my poor friend Bowdy one bed & furniture

Send Spies unto my son Willoughby Bowdy and Ted Sparritus

then I give unto my daughter Clothy Powder one bed furniture

I turn I go into my daughter's little solid good bed furniture

Item I gave unto my wife Hizia Dowdy, son Spruce Dowdy

son William by Bowdoy, daughter Blakey Bowdoy and

Daughters Selah Hardy, sixteen behind to be equalled.

divided between them all, to them and their heirs

I now I give unto my wife Kezia Lowdy, son Milloughly
