

In the name of God Amen John Lindsey of the County of Currituck And State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound disposing mind And memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same And Calling to mind the uncertainty of this life Do make this Instrument of writing to be my last Will And Testament Disavowing all former wills by me made first of all I bequeath my soul to Almighty God that gave it me And my body to be buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named And As touching for my worldly estate that it has been pleased God to bless me with I dispose of in manner and form following first I Desire all my just Debts shall be paid by my Executors And as for the rest of my Estate I Dispose as follows

Item first I lend to my beloved wife Priscilly Lindsey One half of my Plantation whereon I now live that is to say the Southward side with all my building During her life Or widowhood Also One Negro man by the name of Isaac Also Two Negro boys by the name of Luke & Sam Also One feather bed And furniture the Above Articles is lent to wife During her life Or widowhood Item I give And bequeath unto my beloved wife Priscilly Lindsey One Negro Woman by the name of Minder And One feather bed And furniture Also all my Stock Also all my household furniture Except Two feather beds to her And her heirs forever Item I give And bequeath unto my beloved Son Joseph Lindsey After the Death Or marriage of his mother all my lands Also One feather bed And furniture Also One Negro man by the name of James Also my hunting gunn And One Gun barrel Also my Rowing Canoe to him And his heirs forever And if my son Joseph Lindsey should die with lawful heirs my will is that my land should be Equally Divided between my Two Daughters Nancy Dought & Elizabeth Lindsey Item I give And bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Nancy Dought One Negro Girl by the name of Lydia And One feather bed And furniture And After the Death Or marriage of her mother One Negro boy the name of Luke to her And her heirs forever Item I give And bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Lindsey One Negro Girl by the name of Rach And After the Death Or marriage of her mother One Negro Boy by the name of Sam And One feather bed And furniture to her And her heirs forever And my will And Desire is that all my Estate that is not given Away At the Death Or marriage of their mother shall be Equally Divided between my Children Joseph Lindsey Nancy Dought Elizabeth Lindsey to them And their heirs forever And I Do Nominate And Appoint my Son Joseph Lindsey And my wife Priscilly Lindsey

Executors to this my last will and Testament in witness to the Above have here unto set my hand Seal this first Day of July 1799.
