

The Last Will and Testament of John Machie
Deceased Exhibited and Proved at May Term 1823
 In the name of God. Amen. I John Machie being of
 sound ^{and perfect} mind and memory (blessed be God) do this the 12th
 day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and twenty two, make and publish this my
 last will and testament in manner following, that is to say
 First I lend to my Daughter Sarah Bell the use of the tract
 of Land lying on Currituck Shore, that I bought of
 James Phillips: Bounded on the south west by the main
 road, on the North by Thomas Macie's Line, on the East
 by the River, & on the South East by John Williams Land
 together with Twenty odd acres adjoining said tract that
 I purchased of Thos. Mercer: to her during her natural life:
 and after her death to her child or children forever.
 I also lend to my daughter Sarah Bell the use of Negroes
 Lucy with her three children Melvinas, Charles and Bob
 during her natural life, and after her death to her child or
 children forever. I give and bequeath to my Daughter
 Sarah Bell, all the household and kitchen furniture
 that she is now in possession of —
 Secondly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Judith
 all that part of Macie's Island contained within the
 following bounds, Beginning at a croppened situate
 about fifteen or twenty yds northwardly of a live
 oak stump, that stands in a Northwardly and West-
 wardly direction from that house that it live in, then
 running eastwardly down said fence to the south
 east corner of the New Ground fence, thence running
 a straight course to the edge of the marsh, where
 my line and the line of Evan Jones here intersect each
 other, thence down the line of the said heirs to a
 white oak, a corner tree, thence a northwardly and
 eastwardly direction to Piney Point in Back Marsh.

thence a straight course to a place called Pins Bridge
 in Back creek, thence the various courses up the creek
 to where it strikes the ditch, thence a southwardly course
 down the ditch to Bullies Bay, thence along the edge
 of the marsh to half Point, thence along the shore a
 westwardly course to little Point and from little Point along
 the bank head to the first flatland with all the improve-
 ments thereto belonging to her and heirs forever.
 Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
 all the residue of Land that I own on Macie's Island
 to her and her heirs forever.
 Fourthly I give and bequeath to my daughters Judith
 Elizabeth, Sarah and Margaret all my fishing Land
 Marsh and shoals, commonly known by the name of
 Raymond's marsh and Herring Island, share and share
 alike to them and their heirs forever.
 Fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughters Sarah Judith
 Elizabeth and Margaret all my salt Land that was
 formerly Thomas Bragg's Seed together with all my salt
 pans and kettles —
 Sixthly I give and bequeath to my grand Son Sycamore
 Fifty acres of Land out of the tract I purchased of James
 Phillips to be laid off next to the land that belongs
 to Lemiah Perkins, Francis Morris heirs and Robert Bell;
 and the residue of said tract of Land and Cypress Swamp
 I bequeath equally to my daughters Sarah Judith and
 Elizabeth.
 Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughters Judith
 Elizabeth and Margaret all my household and kitchen
 furniture that is now on Macie's Island to them and
 their heirs forever.
 Eighthly It is my will and desire that all my negroes
 (except those lent to my daughter Sarah Bell) be sold at
 a credit of six months and the money arising from the
 sale of said negroes I give and bequeath equally to my

Daughters Judith, Elizabeth and Margaret. I also wish the whole of my stock consisting of Horses, Cattle, Hogs and Sheep to be sold on a credit of six months and the money arising from the sale of said stock I wish to be equally divided between my Daughters Judith, Elizabeth and Margaret. I also wish my large Flat Sail Boat and 2 casks and 3 canoes all my runs into and Fish Lands all my crop and every thing not given away to be sold on a credit of six months and the money arising from the sale thereof, after paying my just debts I give and bequeath equally to my Daughters Judith, Elizabeth and Margaret.

And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Eideon C. Marchant Executor and my daughter Eideith the Executrix of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said John C. Mackie have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

The Last Will and Testament of Francis Gregory Deceased Exhibited and Proved at a May Term 1822.

Currituck County } In the name of God Amen
Francis Gregory of the aforesaid County being found and perfectly minded & memory (helped by God) do the fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty one make & publish this my last will & testament in manner following, that is to say:

First, I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Eunice Gregory one feather Bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my son Enoch Gregory one Feather Bed and furniture, and one Bull Yearling of a brindled colour and also one half of the Indian Corn made on Samuel Ferber's and Jeremiah Etheridge's Land to him and his heirs forever.

Third, I give and bequeath unto my son Jey Gregory one feather Bed and furniture, and one Bull Yearling of a pided colour and also the remaining half of Indian corn made on Samuel Ferber's and Jeremiah Etheridge's Land, to him and his heirs forever.

I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Eunice Gregory and sons Enoch and Jey Gregory thirty one yards of Finer Cloth to be equally divided between them for sheeting &c.

And all the remainder of my property I leave to be sold for the settlement of my just debts and if any remains after my lawfull debts is paid the remainder to be equally divided between my Daughter Eunice and sons Enoch and Jey Gregory to them and their heirs forever in the name of God Amen.

And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Samuel Ferber to be executor of this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I the said Francis Gregory have to this my
