The Last Will & Testament of John Chaplain
 Deceased proved November Term 1831
 State of North Carolina
 Currituck County In the name of God Amen
 I John Chaplain of the County & State aforesaid
 being of sound disposing mind & memory
 (although feeble in body) I have to be
 for the same - being to mind the uncertainty
 of life and the certainty of death, do make and
 ordain this my last Will and Testament in
 manner and form as follows. First I give
 unto my daughter Polly Toller one feather
 bed & furniture, one cow and calf and the use
 of the Hall room of the house I live in, provided
 she does not sell nor rent it out but occupy
 it herself and one binner wheel to her and
 her heirs forever - Secondly I give unto my
 beloved wife Ann Chaplain my negro
 woman called Gracy, two feather beds fur-
 niture unto her and her heirs forever
 Thirdly - I leave to my beloved wife Ann
 Chaplain my old negro man James and woman
 Pheaby all my kitchen furniture, I also leave to
 my wife the married plantation and all the
 woodland belonging thereto and the Windmill
 with a privilege to sell the mill if she may think
 proper to pay my just debts - I also leave to her
 all my cattle except the cow & calf I gave to my
 daughter Polly, all my gang of hogs, all my sheep
 and my mare and horse coat. I also leave her
 all my farming tools - I also leave unto her
 all my bacon and Pork all my corn and all my
 things in doors and out doors that is not lent
 or given away - I also leave her my lights and
 canoes and all my nets with a privilege to
 sell such things as she may think proper
 to pay my just debts - Lastly after the death
 of my wife Ann Chaplain I give and

begin at all the property I have lent to
my daughter Polly Tolas to her & her heirs
forever - Lastly I nominate, constitute
and appoint my beloved wife Army
Chaplain my whole & sole executrix to
this my last will & testament and request
my friend Spencer Ball to assist her as
she may need - In witness whereof I
have set my hand & seal February 21st
1831

possession - I also lend the half of cedar field
or tract of land that I bought of Samuel Taylor
to my beloved wife her life time

I give and bequeath to my grandson
Luke Tatum the land and plantation that
I now own - I give I lend my daughter
Harriet Tatum the cedar field and land below
going to it her life time - I also lend my
daughter Harriet Tatum, fifty acres of bank
land her life time term - I give to
my beloved wife one hundred acres of
bank land and I do hereby nominate and
appoint my wife Julia Robinson and Isaac
Parker executrix to this my last will & testament
revoking all former wills hereto made

my hand this fourteenth day of November
one thousand Eight Hundred & thirty one
