

The Last Will and Testament of John Sanderson decd
Exhibited and proved At November Term 1823.

State South Carolina, In the name of God Amen—
Currituck County & John Sanderson of the County &
State aforesaid, being weak in body but of sound & perfect mind
and memory, blessed be god Almighty for the same do make
and publish this my last will & testament in manner & form
following (that is to say) First I give & bequeath unto my
beloved wife Eloah Sanderson a part or parcel of my Land
whereon I live beginning at the River at the dividing Lane
between me and my brother Daniel, then up said Lane to
the little ditch thence along said ditch to the Branch from
thence down to the river including the cleared Land, to have
and hold during her natural life— Also negro man Thomas
negro woman Prathy & negro girl Finner to her by his be-
forever— also one riding chaise & harness and one horse, one
best bed & furniture, one best Table all the beautiful Furniture
I also give & bequeath unto my son Daniel Sanderson
the whole of the Tract of Land I now live on, also negro man
Bempany, negro girl Mary, I also give & bequeath unto my
Daughter Darks Sanderson negro girl Beliny, negro Boy
Thomas, negro Boy Mills & negro Boy Andrew— Further more
I give & bequeath to my Daughter Darks Sanderson the
Amount which my property not given away may sell
for in new Gold— I do appoint my Uncle Daniel Lindsey
Senr my sole executor of this my last will & testament.
hereby revoking all former wills by me made— Having
whereof set my hand & seal the second day of June in the
year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred & twenty three
Signed, sealed, published & declared by the above
John Sanderson to be his last will & testament
in the presence of us & have subscribed in his presence
John Sanderson
July 7 Sanderson

N.B. It is also my will and desire that my two old
negroes Jones and Peggy shall stay on the said plantation
whom then now time of thought given by my executors
and the profits of said negroes to go to my daughter
Darks Sanderson and if my Executor should think
best not to continue in said Land I do empower
him to act as he may think best for my aforesaid
Daughter
