The First and Testament of Col: John Woodhouse late of this
County deceased was in open Court exhibited Proved and
The respective Executors thereof Dealt with in due form of Law
The said Will where made to be Recorded & Stands as follows

North Carolina
Carrickc County In the Name of God Amen.

In the year of our Lord 1772 the 2d Day of July.
John Woodhouse of the County after being very sick and weak
of Body but of a Perfect mind & Memory thanketh to God for
the same therefore calling to mind that he is appointed to
man once to die do in the and certain this my Last Will and
Testament in manner & terms as following Vizt
I John Woodhouse and first of all I give to Recorner and wife
to the honor of Almighty God that her soul come to me nothing
doubting but trusting in the merits of my Redeemer to secure
her soul unto God by him. As to my Body I command it to
be buried in a Christian like
manner at the discretion of my executors unless the same
nothing doubting but to be done by my mighty Power of God
and touching such worldly Goods & Estates wherewithal it hath
pleased almighty God to bless me with I give & bequeath
in the manner and form following

I give & bequeath to my son John Woodhouse my
Plantation & Lands Belonging to that Lieu Belote of the
Land of W. Jangward & Hough Which is known by the Name of
Chappuch Island and unto him & the Heirs of his Body Inequitable
Bequeath forsooth I also give unto my son John and his wife Heath
Name of Hanes & Conroy young Negroe fellow named Tom & his
wife Negroes Esq: a Seafar: & a Negroe & Timers and their
children & one Negroe boy named Charon & Negro to be lawfully
Breed and one Negroe boy named Cuffe. To him also give unto my
son John all such Stock of cattle that is at or Belonging unto the
Plantation that I have & lawfully given him & also eight Head of
Cattle taken from the Stock of cattle that belongeth to the Plant-
ation to him given above. I also give unto my two sons James
Timothy Woodhouse & to the Heirs of them & also lawfully by the
Power of my Last Will & Testament Belonging thereto, I lawfully give
Name of my Plantation to be Equally Divided Between them
and the heirs of them & also lawfully Bequeath to my son John
Woodhouse

I also give unto my son John Woodhouse one Negroe boy of
Drawing & one Negroe girl known by being Commonly
call'd & known as that Negroe Boy and Negroe girl

I also give unto my son John Woodhouse Thirty Three Half pounds
Weight of Silver Dots. my Will & Desire is that my
Negroe fellow Joney should be sold by my Executors who shall
divide and the Money arising therefrom his Sale to be paid
Dividends between my two Sons John & Samuel Woodhouse I
also giving to my Son John one Negroe Scumble

Ilem. I give and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Woodhouse
my Land and Plantation wherein I now live to him
the Heirs of his Body lawfully Begotten forever

I give unto my Son Samuel Woodhouse one Negroe
boy named Sam and two Negroe girls named Sis
& Cham & three more also two Negroe Boys named
Ned & Will also one Negroe fellow named Sam and one Negroe
boy named Daniels. I also give unto my Son Sam & all his
Stock of cattle at Poynters Farm except four Cows and Calves
and all my Stock of cattle that Belongs to the Plantation
Wherem John lies except Eight Head that I have given
out of them to my Son John. I also give unto my son
Samuel Woodhouse also my Land that lieth on the
Bankes, and my Will and Desire is that my Stock of cattle
that runs the said Land at the Bankes Should be Excepted
the Cows and Calves be Sold by my Executors and the
Money arising from the Sale to be Equally Divided And
between my three Children John & Sam: Woodhouse
and Mary Saunders

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I have given my Son Lemuel Woodhouse one Cherry tree
out of Drawers and one Mahogany Desk known by his self,
his Master & also two feather beds & Fourteen dollars and Two
Hundred Dollars and one Silver Cup.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Stansbury
my Plantation and Lands belonging to it on the Ridge lying between
the Land of Captain Bayne and Mrs. Lorn more to her and her
Heirs Lawfully begotten of her Body, and all my Stockes the
belonging to the said Land and Plantation and Four Cows and Calves
to be taken out of my Stock. to Peigners Island & Two Cows &
Calves to be to her out of my Stock to the Banks I also give unto
my Daughter Mary Stansbury one negro fellow named Demi
and one Negro Wench Name Indian and one Negro Boy, named
Peter Evans young Negro Wench Marnie & a Negroe
Dog named Peter and one Young Dog named Jack belonging
me Negroe Wench Name Jacky and one Negroe Girl Name
Lena, I also Give unto my Daughter Mary Stansbury my Ark
and two feather Beds & Furniture and one Hamper or Box
Item I give and Bequeath unto Sarah Creek County Penna
Cawky and my will and Desires that if she shall die
One of Shalld be Delivered of Child which she is now
Pregnant with, that my Executors shall advance as much
of my Estate as will Purchase a Negroe Girl and Give the
Negroe that is so Purchased to the Child, &

Item, I Give all the Remainder Part of my Estate to the wife
Doris and next unto my two Sons John & Lem. Woodhouse
to be Equally divided between them, and my Will and Desires
is that of either Son my two Sons John or Lemuel Woodhouse
should die without a lawful Issue begotten of their bodies
then the Part and Legacy of him that shall so Die and
fall and be to his Bro. and the Heirs of his Body always byt
then forever, my Will and Desire is that my Grandson
John Woodhouse shall have my Goods & Chattels
free bearing Given him so far as he will Dearly take them
by my Common Branch of Business for me to sell my
Slavery is for him to have Extraordinary Good Learning &
the Utmost of Giving him such to be Paid out of his Dues
my Will and Desire that my Trusty friend Saml. Purvis
Supt and my Son John Woodhouse shall have my Heirs left
my whole Estate Executors of this my last Will & Testament
and utterly Disannulling all others. In testimony

Examiner thereof Qualifying in due forme of Law the said Will
whereon to be Recorded stands as follows. Nige

In the name of God am I John Woodhouse of Guilford
of Brunelicks North Carolina being very sick & weak
of a Distempore and memory than he be to God &
therefore laying to mind the uncertainty & Instability
of man's life and knowing that a Man is appointed
to die I do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament
in manner & forme following. That is to say and
Principally I recommend my soul into the hands of my
mighty God that gave it the first.

Item, I Give the use of my Plantation and Lands
unto my well beloved Wife Rhoda Bessley during her
Widowhood and after her Marriage and Death of my Will
Desire is for it to fall to my Son John Bessley & his Heirs
forever. Item, I Give & bequeath unto my son Henry
Bessley one Young Mare Name & Lida & Her Increase
& Whitch was Given to her by her Grand Mother Elizabeth
Gandy & a Hell fire & Gun and all my Working
Tools & Smithy & Turners Tools & Hallow Carpenter
Tools after his Mothers Marriage or Death.

Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Eliz. with
Waterfield one Iron Pot one Pewter Basin & Wooden Plate
one Small Chest one Chair & all the Cattle in her Marks
already in her Possession. Item, I Give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Sarah Rodgers one Tea Cup Bed &
Chests & Pot Harness a Pewter Dish two Plates and
a Basin & one Tow Sheet already in her Possession

Item, I Give unto my Daughter Anna Mary Morris
one two one Pewter Dish and a Basin and a Plate already
in her Possession. Item, I Give unto my Daughter
Julian Bessley one Feather Bed & Furniture belonging
to it one Chest one Iron Pot a Pewter Plate
Death
