I then I leave to my daughter Dorcas Forbes and son
Hadley Wood house Negro man Jacob and woman
Sarah and her increases to be equally divided
between them and if either of them should die
without lawful heirs legatines on their body
there part to belong to the other.

My Will and desire is that negro Jacob & Sarah
shall Continue on My Plantation until my death
Also I leave unto My daughter Dorcas Forbes one par-
ticular bed and Chest Also I leave unto my son
Hadley Wood house one feather Bed provided
that the aforesaid Hadley Wood house and Dorcas
Forbes both never run for any other negroes over
belonging to my Estates or cause any dues or costs
if they do the beforenamed Negro to be sold for six months
credit and the amount of account of sale to be
equally Divided between the rest of my Children
then I leave to my wife all the Money and Notes
that I have for the purpose of Schooling my small
Children at her discretion

I then I leave unto my daughter Polly Gregory one negroe
girl Rose and if she should die without lawful heirs
legatines on her body the said Negroe to go to my
six smallest Children also one bed and furniture
one Cow and Calf one Chest and table where her
Cow and Calf shall let a table she has had.

I then my Will and desire is that my negro Boy named
Jordan be sold by my Executor for six months credit
any the Money arising from the sale of said negro
I leave the one half unto my daughter Polly Gregory
and the other half of the Money arising from the
sale of the said Negro I give unto my six smallest
Children. Then I leave unto my wife Mrs. Woodhouse
during her widow hood the use of all the remainder
part of my Estate not mentioned in this will and
until her Marriage or death my will and desire is
that what property shall remain be sold for six
months credit and the Money or notes arising from
such sale to be equally divided between my six smallest
Children. — Since I hereby make and ordain my above
wife Mrs. Woodhouse my whole and sole Executor
of this my last Will and testament in witness whereof
I the said Hadley Woodhouse hath hereunto set
my hand and seal this the 2d day of May AD 1821
by me testator to be his last will ^{and} Testament

The Non caputative wills of Joseph Williams dec'd
were exhibited and proved May Term 1821.

In proportion of Amey Williams to prove the non caputative
will of Joseph Williams deceased Peter Brady being duly
swor in open Court on the body Evangelist of
Almighty God deposeth that Joseph Williams deceased
on his death bed about the 7th of February 1821 declared
that he wished his wife Amey Williams to have
the property she brought to him at their marriage
and that all the rest of his property should be
divided among his Children — This witness further
swears that he does not believe the property belonging
to the said Joseph would sell for two hundred
dollars whereupon it is ordered by the court that
this be filed and recorded as the Non caputative
will of said Joseph Williams.

The last Will and Testament of Dinah
Payner was exhibited and proved at
February Term 1830.

February the first day Eighteen hundred
and thirty. In the name of God amen
I Dinah Payner being very sick and
weak but in perfect mind and memory
thankes be to Almighty God for living to
mind the Mortality of my body and know-
ing that it is once appointed for all to
as far as it has pleased God to Endeavour
with my worldly goods I doe part of
it in the following manner first of
all I give unto Peadian Sawyer
all my slaves. Item I give unto
Dinah Payner one third of my moveable
Estate and the other two thirds to
Peadian Sawyer I acknowledge this to
be my last Will and Testament
ascended with my hand in the presence
