 I Do appointe my well Beloved Wife Angilore Dauge and my son Willoughby Dauge, to be my Sole Executors of this my Last will and Testament, and I Do hereby Disannull all and every other former Testament, Wills Legacies, Bequests, and Letters by me in any wise before this time named, written and Bequeathed ratifying and Confirming, this and no other to be my last will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Twelfth day of Nov.  the Sixteenth Day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy eight I Joseph Midgett of Cheshire, comes and in the County of Litchfield Gentleman being very Sick & weak in body but of perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto god, therefore calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to say principally and First of all I Give and Recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my body I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and Decent manner at the Direction of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again but the mighty power of god and as touching such worldly estate where with it hath pleased god to bless me in this life I Give advise and Dispose of the same in the following manner and form
 Imprimis. I Give and bequeath to Angilore My Dearley beloved wife one feather bed one yong Mare one Cheet one Cow & Calfs and all my moveable Estate During her widowhood to raise the yong Children and at her Managers Death to be Equally Divided among them
 Then I Give to my youngest son George Midgett the Land wharton they live to him and his lawfull heirs And likewise my son Christopher Midgett whom I like wise constitute make and ordain my only Sole Executor of this my last will and Testament
