Impremise I Give to my Loving Wife Mary Poyner the Plantation and Land therein now lived on till my death. Robert and James Poyner being at the full age of twenty one of the Shrocks (entirely single) With what Personal Estate I have Within Door and without to Plantation and Support my two Sons, but my Wife should have before my two Sons come of Age, then the before named Estate as if (Land Excepted) to be sold and the Monies arising to be put at interest for my two Sons until they come of Age & be then Equally divided between them. My two Sons Robert and James Poyner to be taken by any Executor and Admin. for their use.

Impremise I Give and bequeath the Land and Plantation now on Between my two Sons Robert and James Poyner, to be Equally Divided between them as follows: from the Canal Richardson River, straight across to the Land my Father Joseph Poyner Deceased in his Lifetime and to Anne's Otheridge. I Give the said Land to them & their Heirs forever.

Item The Land bought of my Mother Anne Poyner Executrix of my Father's, which was left by him to be sold - I desire to be sold by my Executors to Discharge my said full Debts.

Item The Right in Myself left my wife by the Father Benjamin Corp I Gave to my Loving Wife During her Widowhood and after her intermarriage, I Give the said Myself leaving two Sons to be Equally Divided between them, to them and their Heirs forever.

Do appoint my Brother Joseph Poyner and Wife Mary Poyner Executors & Administrators of this my last Will.

And the same in Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and placed my Seal the 16th Day of November in the 11th month year of our Reign 1776.

a piece of Land running as follows beginning at the old log house gate thence East along Miller's line unto Cal's Branch thence North to the Sound side. I Give and bequeath unto Comfort my beloved Wife all the Remainder of my Land During her Natural Life or Widowhood and after which to be Divided between my two young Sons James & Robert and I bequeath unto my Wife all my household Furniture Excepting one bed and one barrel of feathers With all my Cattle. I Give and bequeath unto my Son Jacob Williams Father and one barrel of feathers to my Son Joseph My Executors shall unto my three Sons Jacob Joseph and James. I do constitute and Ordain my dear Sons Jacob Williams and Joseph Williams my Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
