Do make this Instrument of writing to be and contain my last Will and  
Testament as follows and first I give to my son Joshua Campbell one Shilling  
Sterling to be paid to him out of my Estate by my executors at any time  
hereafter when they are Quarrelled and he shall demand the same.  
Item I send to my wife Elizabeth Campbell During her life the use of the  
following things to have no further care and trouble me Pillows and  
Woolen and Cotton Cord and have it in the same bed that  
John Cowell and Anna Campbell Junr. always slept in all the  
Year 1775 the best Canopy Parlor by the girls Doreas and  
Julia with two Cows and oxen Two Horses and Fives  
Chimonee little round Table and one large Square Dr's  
Boggs Dr. no Pewter Dish Plate & Plates and small leather Boxes  
Without her wrong apparel to do Deal with them as she  
pleases and that is enough more than all I ever got by Her all  
the stock of sheep likewise Give her Executive three that is two Ewes  
and a Ram.

Item And all the two Lands her inheriting my Estate that is not mentioned above  
both of Goods and Chattels lands and Tenements to me belonging or in  
any way appertaining I do give to my Granddaughter Sarah Mackey  
to her and her heirs brother and sisterwise even John Mackey and my  
said Granddaughter Sarah Mackey my hole and sole Executrix of this my  
last Will and Testament and I do hereby Disannul and Make void all  
other Wills heretofore made or done by me before and concerning this  
and no other to be my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I  
have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty Day of December in  
the year of our Lord Christ 1775 Signed Sealed Promised and Delivered

the Testimony Executors Executrix Quarrelled by taking the  
oath by Law required and directed for me of law this said  
Hills Hand, now recorded as follows.

In the Name of God I men the twenty third Day of  
April 1766 Obijah Angell of the County of Cowpens  
being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect Memory  
thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the Mortality  
of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men  
to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament  
First of all Recommanding my Soul into the hands of Almighty  
God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be  
buried at the discretion of my Executors and as touching such  
Estate whereof I am possessed I give to my wife Dr. Dr.  
in his life Rie and Disposse of the same in manner following  
Imprimis I give unto my Daughter Peggy George the sum of  
Fifteen Shillings and no more Except what I have all  
ready Given to her.

I give unto my Daughter Agnes the sum of Fifteen Shillings  
and no more except what I have already Given to her  
Item I send unto my Wife all my Land and Houses wherem so ever  
I live Except fifty acres lying in the Main River I desire to have  
left in case I should not live to sell it my self and the Money  
Given to her for the Support of her and the family  
Item I likewise send all my Money bills Estate Goods and Chattels to  
my wife and do give her to take care of my Daughter Elizabeth  
and support her as long as she lives  
Item at the Death of my self I give and bequeath unto my Daughter  
Elizabeth all my Lands Houses Goods and Chattels to her own  
use and exec.

Item it is my Desire that my Estate shall not be Appraised but
