 Do make this Instrument of Writing to be and contain my last Will and
 Testament as follows and first I give to my Son John Campbell one Shilling
 Sterling to be paid to him out of my Estate by my Executors at any time
 hereafter when they are Qualified and he shall Demand the same -
 Item I lend to my Wife Elizabeth Campbell During her life the use of the
 following things To wit and for her bed and chamber one Pillow and
 Pillow case and bedstead Cord and hide it is the same bed that
John Cowell and John Campbell Jun: always slept on all the
 year 1773 the bed can be easily proved by the girls Dorcas and
Jill Crowlles two Cozen and sisters Two Towels and Three Towels
Opium one little round table and one one large square Orange
leggs D. one Newter Dish three D. plates one small leather Trunk
 with all her wearing apparrell as do Deal with them as she
 shall think fit - and that is enough more than all I ever got by - Not all
 the stock of sheep I have and give her excepting three that is two ewes
 and a Ram.

Item - And as the test is no here in my Estate that is not mentione I see
 both of Gods and Chastice ands and Toniments to me belonging or in
 any wise appertaining I give to my Granddaughter Sarah Mackey
 To her and her heirs breed and childrens issue John Mackies and my
 said Granddaughter Sarah Mackies my heirs and sole Executors of this my
 last Will and Testament and I do hereby Decern and Make void all
 other Wills herebefore made or done by me ratifying and confirming this
 and no other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Twenty Day of December in
 the Year of our Lord Christ 1775 - signed sealed pronounced and Delivered
 in the presence of us.

 the Contents perused. Executed and Qualified by being the
 Oath by Law prescribed. all in due form of Law; the said
 Wills stand, now recorded as follows.

In the Name of God I know the twenty third Day of
 January 1766. Uriah Angell of the County of Currituck
 being very sick and weak in Body but of perfect Memory
 Thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the Mortality
 of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once
 to Die, do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
 First of all Recommending my Soul into the Hands of Almighty
 God that gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be
 buried at the Direction of my Executors and as Touching such
 Estate wherof it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow on me
 in this life I give and Dispose of the same in Manner following
 In Premis I give unto my Daughter Rejy the sum of 10
Pounds Shillings and No more, Except what I have already
 given to her.

Item I give unto my Daughter Agnes the sum of 15 Shillings
 and no more except what I have already given to her.
 Item I lend unto my Wife all my Land and Shaves wherof I
 possess except fifty acres lying in the Main River, I reserve a true
 Gold in Case I should not live to sell it my self and the Money
 given to her for the Support of her and the family.
 Item I give unto John all my Moveable Estate Goods and Chattels to
 my Wife and do give her to take Care of my Daughter Carabell
 and Support her as long as she lives.
 Item at the Death of my Wife I give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Mildred all my Land Shaves Goods and Chattels to her and
 her heirs forever.
 Item it is my Desire that my Estate shall not be Appraised (Seal)
