

In the name of God amen. I the undersigned day of December in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and four I Mary White of the State of North Carolina, in the County of Sursum, being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, thank be given unto God, therefore calling into mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I Give and recommend my Soul into the hands of God, that gave it, and for my body I recommend it to the earth, to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner, at the discretion of my exe- cutors, nothing doubting but at the General resurrection, I shall again receive the same. by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God, to bless me in this life, I Give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form.

First, it is my will and I do ordain in the first place, all my Just debt and funeral charges be paid and satisfied.  
I Give to my Son Henry White one feather bed with the mattress and bed thereunto belonging, one shaver two years old and the half of the Quack of a shaver and oil, and likewise ten dollars in money to pay for one year's schooling.  
I Give to my Son Melany White one feather bed with the furniture thereunto belonging, and bed thereon, one shaver two years old and the half of the Quack and oil, and six dollars in money to pay for one year's schooling.  
I Give to my Daughter Emily White one new named Susan with the fall and six dollars in money one wash basin and nine earthen plates. I Give to my daughter Lydia White my shaver two years old and brimmed likewise, the riding chair and lamp, likewise the feather for to put into her bed, and the wooden cabinet, one wash basin, and nine earthen plates, and all the remainder of my money with the notes and bonds, and the hire of the negro Peter and Conner, all the remainder of my property to be paid of the Money to be equally divided between my two daughters Amy and Lydia.  
I likewise make and ordain my only and full executory, Malachi Jones and Anthony Hume, of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby fully, discharge, acquit and absolve, all and every other will, Testament, legacy, and executor, ratifying and confirming this and the other, to be my last and only Testament, in solemn witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year first written. Mary White

In the name of God amen, I Sarah Cherry of the County of Sursum, and the State of North Carolina being sick in body, but of perfect mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is to say, after I have first paid the debt of my estate, I Give to my beloved wife Lydia Cherry during the term of her natural life, and also to let and dispose of the same as she shall think fit, now it is my desire that after the death of my beloved wife, Lydia Cherry, that all my estate shall be sold for six months credit, and the money equally divided between my two daughters, Meriam Jones and Alia Perry. I likewise I testify and appoint my beloved wife Lydia Cherry, and my trusty friend Aaron Wright Esquire, to be the full executor, of this my last will and Testament, and hereby swear and Disavow with testimony by me made, and declare this to be my last will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this nineteenth Day of March, in the Year of our Lord, anno Domini 1805.
