The last will and Testament of Willoughby  
Dozier deceased Exhibited and proved Aug. term 1818

In the name of God, amen. I Willoughby Dozier being of sound  
mind and memory, but very sick in body, calling unto mind, knowing  
it is appointed for all men <sup>to</sup> die. — Item. I give and bequeath  
unto William Humphries, John Humphries and Chloë Humphries a  
tract of land called Harris' place, ninety six acres more or less.  
Item. I give unto William Humphries a negro boy named Sampson.  
Item. I give unto John Humphries a negro boy by the name of Isaac.  
Item. I give unto Chloë Humphries a negro man called Caesar.  
Item. I give all the residue of my estate land and personal property to  
equally divided amongst my brothers and sisters, except brother Brock  
Dozier, after paying my Just debts. I constitute Joseph Dozier and  
David Dozier my whole and sole executors to this my last will and Testament  
In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day  
August, Anno Domini 1818.

The last will and Testament of Nathaniel Quaidley  
deceased Exhibited and proved at Aug. term 1818.

In the name of God, Amen. I Nathaniel Quaidley of the county of  
Currituck and State of North Carolina, being at present in reasonable  
health and sound of mind and memory, considering the certainty of death  
and the uncertainty of life, do make these presents following my last  
will and Testament. Viz. Item the first, I give and bequeath unto  
my beloved wife Catharine Quaidley the house and land whereon I  
now live to her and her heirs forever. I also give unto my beloved wife  
Catharine Quaidley twenty five acres of land on the Ingreem Island  
to her and her heirs forever. I also give unto my beloved wife Catharine  
Quaidley one negro man by the name of Peter to her and her heirs forever.  
I also give unto my beloved wife Catharine Quaidley one cow and calf,  
one sow and pig, and six dry hogs, and all my moveable property within  
doors and without, not before given away in this will, say one horse, one  
cart, one net, one chest, and various other articles too tedious to mention  
I give and bequeath unto my beloved brothers and sisters. Viz. to the heirs  
of J. P. Quaidley five shillings to be equally divided amongst them,  
to the heirs of Demoy Quaidley five shillings, to be equally divided  
amongst them, to Joseph Quaidley five shillings, to Peggy Quaidley  
five shillings, to Bartlett Quaidley five shillings and to Sally Quaidley  
five shillings, and I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint  
my beloved wife Catharine Quaidley my whole and sole executrix

After paying all my Just debts and legacies as above stated, I do this my last will  
and Testament, reciting all and every other will or wills by me made. My  
witness my hand the 14th day of March 1818.

The last will and Testament of Josiah Lowry Junr.  
deceased. Exhibited and proved at Novm. term 1818.

In the name of God, amen. I Josiah Lowry Junr. of the state of North  
Carolina and Currituck county, being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind  
and memory, thanks be to God for the same, calling to mind the mortality of my  
body and knowing that it appointed for all men once to die do make such and  
certain this my last will and Testament, in manner following. —

I give and bequeath unto my sister Grace Lowry my land on the banks, to her  
and her heirs forever. I also give unto Grace Lowry my sister one feather  
bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. I have sixty dollars in a note  
to be applied in paying of my debts. I have my mare saddle and bridle to be  
sold. I also leave my drum, my gun and my half of a cart to be sold, and  
the money arising from the sale of said articles to be applied to payment of  
debts. I also all other articles belonging to my estate to be sold.

Lastly, I appoint Thomas Payne my Executor. In witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of September 1818
