Item I lend to Wisk Wallace during his natural life one tract of Land known by the name of the Robinson tract and one half of my new patent swamp Land and at his death to be equally divided between his four sons Bartholomew David Lewis and Dennis to them and their heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my two Grand Daughters Enla Wallace and Meriah Wallace one Negro girl Abigail and increase to them and their heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son Dennis W. Danton one tract of Land where on I formerly lived known by the name of the White tract and one half of my new Patent swamp Land one Negro boy named Jeffery one feather bed and furniture one table one chest and set of stool chairs to him and his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julia Bayner one Negro girl named Rachel and increase one Negro girl named Jim and one negro man named Leffer to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son David Danton one negro boy named Jack one negro girl named Harriet and increase one tract of Blank Land that I bought of Robert White out of the old patent to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son Alexander Danton one negro boy named Spence one Negro girl named Sophuck and three hundred dollars in cash one feather bed and furniture one set of stool chairs and one table to him and his heirs

I give and bequeath to my son Levin Banton one negro named Simon one negro girl named Rose one negro girl named Margaret and their increase three hundred dollars in cash one feather bed and furniture one table and one set of stool chairs to him and his heirs

I leave the use of my salt tract of Beach Land and Water tract to my four sons David, David, Alexander & Levin to them and their heirs.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Polly Banton the Land that I bought on Piney Island to her & her heirs

I leave all the Remainder of my Estate both with in horse and with out to be sold and the money to be Equally divided between all my children and my beloved wife and my Grand children the of Springs of Birch and Nancy Ballance.
