


State of North Carolina, being very low and weak, but in perfect mind  
and memory, thanks be given to god for the same, calling unto mind  
the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men  
once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that  
is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my  
soul unto Almighty God, that gave it, and my body I recommend  
to the earth to be buried decent Christian burial at the discretion of my  
executors, not doubting but at the general resurrection I shall  
receive the same again by the mighty power of god, and as  
touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased god to bless  
me with in this life I give devise and dispose of in the following  
manner and form. First I give unto my wife Rachel Barnard  
all and singular my property after paying my just debts,

within doors and without doors to her and her heirs and assigns forever, only at the freedom or marriage of Polly Caves owing to give her one bed and furniture: also I leave my wife Rachel Barnard and James Beadle my sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament, and I hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, legacies, bequests and executors by me in any way before named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the tenth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten.

in body but in perfect mind and memory and knowing that all men  
must die therefore I will and constitute first I give my soul to God  
that gave it after my decease I desire that all my just debts should be paid  
as for my worldly goods I give as follows. I give and bequeath to my  
daughter Fanny all my land and tenements belonging thereto  
and all my moveable property in doors and out after the death of my  
wife or widow to her and her heirs forever and if my daughter  
Fanny should decease this life before she arrives to the age of twenty  
one or marries I give the whole of my Estate to my wife to dispose  
of as she should please two boats and one gun to be sold at six  
months credit for the support of my wife and child this being  
my desire And now to conclude I leave my beloved wife and  
Thomas Tillet my sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament  
disannulling all others and have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal  
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten.  
May 7th 1810.


