 the top in the branch there running along a right to a black Pine then
 turning a right corner to a Laurel Oak standing in some grass like
 to him of his then forming up the road and coming off by the end that the
 there is now with fear south the more is of the name of Virginia

Him I give and bequeath unto my Loving Son Grandson Davis
 For all the remainder part of my Land & plantation that is
 Joining the Land I have to my Grandson John Lee to him &
 His heirs forever And I Give to my aforesaid Grandson Davis Lee one
 Negro Boy by the Name of Henry to him & his heirs forever.
 In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and the Seal of
 my Office this 22nd day of November 1734

Str^l I beg to request that my loving Grandson James
 be kept the name of James. I wish him to be
 two sons and James. You may by the name of James to him
 and his happiness.

Now I beg to request that my Connection Andrew Lee Burdgo
Woman by full name of her & him & his heirs forever.

I have by birthright made my Grand daughter Sarah Austin
 As happy God by the name of Jesus like two Sons and I wish if
 I could I would do her like your dear Son.

I am I have and his wife unto my Son & Daughter in Law
 One Negro Girl by the name of ~~Elizabeth~~ ^{Elizabeth}

the negro Wife by the name of ~~the~~ Mary to this John herefore
 Item I do bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary the one
 Negro Wife by the name of Nancy & one Child by the name
 of Peter to this John herefore

Then I give by bequest unto my Loving Son Thomas Cox
All the Remainder Part of my ~~estate~~ ^{property} that is not already
Given Away in deed of gift Deed to him & his heirs forever.
