

The Last Will & Testament of John Daniel deceased. Exhibited & proved in the Superior Court at Spring Term 1829.

In the name of God, amen. I John Daniel of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina, in my right mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament. Firstly, I leave my land and tenements which I now reside to be sold at the discretion of my executor, and my land at black hall likewise, and as much of my chattle property as my executor and wife see proper. I likewise want all my just debts to be paid; afterwards I want all the nett proceeds of my property to be my beloved wife, to hold forever for her use and benefit, to dispose of as she pleases only a reasonable support for my mother as long as she lives, which is to be delt out at the discretion of my executor and I further more leave my beloved friend Adam Ethington whole & sole executor to this my last will being ~~testament~~ in my right mind and memory as witness my hand & seal this 26th of March 1827.

The Last Will and Testament of Mary Ballance deceased. proved November Term 1829.

In the name of God, amen. I Mary Ballance of the State of North Carolina, Currituck County, being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, be it so God for the same I do, this day, make and publish my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say first I lend unto my daughter in law Sarah Ballance her natrel lief in my land and plantation where I formerly lived, her natrel life, to make what use of the places and after her death to be equally divided between my three grand sons, whose names is Samuel Ballance and John Ballance and Mesley Ballance, also I give and bequeath unto Sarah Ballance my grand daughter one feather bed first choice also one cow and calf first choice and all the remainder to be equally divided between my four grand children, Samuel Ballance and Sarah Ballance & John Ballance and Mesley Ballance and I appoint my grandson Samuel Ballance my lawful executor, to this

my last Will and testament, revoking all other
wills by me made to the present date, as
witness whereunto I have set my hand and ^{seal} test
this 20th day of February 1822.

The Last Will & Testament of William Walker deceased proved Novr Term 1829.

March the twenty fourth day one thousand, Eight
Hundred and Twenty nine. In the name of God
Amen. I William Walter being sick but in
perfect mind and memory, thank be to God,
calling mind the mortality of my body, know-
ing it is now appointed for all men to die and
as it has pleased God to endow me with my worldly
goods I dispose of them as follows.

I lend unto my wife Kanief all my land and property during her natural life, my widow after the death or marriage of my wife, I give unto my son Isaac Walker the land I bought of Thomas Williams to him and his heirs forever, the land whereon I now live, I give unto my son William Walker to him & his heirs forever I give unto my son Isaac one cow, I give unto my daughter Courtney one featherbed

and furniture also one spinning wheel also one
table also one chest, also two hogs, I give unto
my daughter July one cow, I give unto my
daughter Edney one cow, I give unto my daugh-
ter Emilly one cow, I give unto my daughter
Godney one cow and yearling, I leave my wife
Fanny to sell property enough to pay my
debts and if my wife marries all my property
to be equally divided between her and my three
daughters July, Edney and Emilly after their
legacies which I have already given and if
she dies before marriage for it to be equally
divided between my three youngest daughters
ratifying this and no other to be my last
will and testament leaving my wife Fanny
and son Isaac Walker executor to this my
last will and testament
