 One thousand eight hundred and two, Make and publish this my last will and Testament.
 In Manner following that is to say, first, I give and bequeath to my six Children
 Hon'r Turtur, Lucy Turtur, Belinda Turtur, Samuel Turtur, George Turtur,
 and Sally Turtur, All my land and Negroes to be equally divided between them
 Six, when the youngest is of age. Agreed to have, to them and their heirs forever,
 And for My land to be settled quarterly. And my Negroes hired Out quarterly till the
 Youngest there is arrived to age by law.
 Item I leave, All the rest of my property within doors and without, to be sold for
 The living and schooling my six Children. And when they are all of age, I give
 And bequeath, to my six above named Children, All my estate to be equally divided.
 Between them and to them and their heirs forever. And thereby make and ordain
 My worthy friends, Caleb Sears and Attithan Simmons, Executrix of this my last
 Will and Testament, in witness whereof, I the said Archibald Turtur, have to this
 my last will and Testament, set my hand and seal, the day and year abovesaid,

 Item I give to my daughter Nancy Berry, One feather bed and furniture also,
 One pair of Gold Ear bobs, and two Gold Rings, to her and her heirs.

Item I give to my daughter Catharine Robertson, one English Shilling that with
 What she has already had to be her full part of my property.

Item I give to my daughter Nancy Crabb, one Shilling and No more, all the rest
 Of my property within and without doors. My desire is that it be equally divided
 Between my three Sonnated Children, Samuel Berry, John Berry, and
 Nancy Berry, so as that my two Sons parts, are equal with my daughters.
 Part and legacies, and if either of them die without heir of their body lawfully together
 Their part to go to the surviving and their heirs. Lastly I nominate as my Appoint
 My son Richard Berry my Executor to this my last will and Testament, in
 witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of

Dec 1803.
