In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirty first day of October, in the year of Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.

First, I give my soul to the Lord who give it, & my body to be buried in a christian like manner, at the discretion of my executors and my worldly goods in manner and form as follows. Item, I leave my land to be sold, and all debts paid, that comes in against me in a due form and the balance to Betty Hewitt, to be, I terminate, constitute and appoint Caleb Caple junr, my whole and sole executor to this my last will and Testament, in witness whereof, I have set my hand, and caused my seal to be affixed this 19th day of May 1815.

I Robert Bell of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, blessed be god, do this 15th day of May, in the year of our Lord 1815, make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following that is to say: First, I give and bequeath to my son Robert Bell all my swamp land lying back of yournigh Perking, also one negro woman named Fel. to him and his heirs forever, also I give and bequeath to my daughter Betty Bell six acres of land where I now live, and one acre of land, lying in a piece of land my mother bought of George Howland, also three hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever. All the remainder of my estate to be sold, and the money to be equal divided between my son Robert Bell and Betty Bell. And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Samuel Thompson and Wollis Bray executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said Robert Bell have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.
