The last Will and Testament of Thomas Morse
Exhibited and proved at May Term 1824.

In the name of God Amen.

I Thomas Morse of the County of Currituck and State of Carolina do make and ordain this my last will and Testament Viz. I leave the plantation called Ppanns to be sold for Fif & Twelve months credit to defray my just debts and should that be insufficient to do so then so much more of my property that can be best spared as will be sufficient. The lands and plantation wherow I now live on Currituck sound or shore I leave the use of together with all the rest or residue of my estate after paying my just debts unto my wife Elizabeth during her natural life after her death I give and bequeath the same unto my sister Julian Morse to her and hers forever to hereby nominate and appoint Thomas C. Knibbe and Doc & Gideon Merchant Executors of this my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the 22nd day of November 1823.

I give to my brother John Chittum the plantation wherow I now
live containing fifty acres More or less joining the lands of James
Dozier orphans also I give all the negroes to my brother John
Chittum named Mary March Harry Sepie Nancy & Eliza
also three Head of Hogs all the hogs all the sheep Eighteen Head
all the Household furniture to my brother John Chittum also
thirty three acres & 1/2 of land joining the lands of Caleb Gregory also
all the farming utensils I give to William Lamp and his Children
one dollar a piece to be raised out of my Estate also a point Willow M^y
D'Barner & my brother John Chittum my sole and sole
Executors to this my last will and testament in Witness whereof
I have set my hand & sealed my seal the 12th day of September 1823.

The last Will and Testament of Nathaniel Hutchings
Exhibited and proved at May Term 1824.

In the name of God Amen.

I Nathaniel Hutchings of the State of Carolina
and County of Currituck being of sound mind and perfect mem-
ory but much impeded in body infirmities and calling to mind
the uncertainty of the time and things of this sublunary world
and knowing that it is appointed that all men shall die etc My
fervent prayer that my soul shoud be by Gods number among
the just and my body have a place Christian like manner of burial
and as to such worldly substance which it hath pleased God to
bestow me with I give and dispose of them in this my last will
and Testament in the following manner Viz. I give and bequeath to my two daughters Anis & Rebecca Hutchings a piece of Swamp lands laying on the south side
of the road that leads to Camden adjoining the lands of
Peter Gregory and the South river stream to be equally divided
between them and their heirs forever also give to my daughter
Anis Hutchings one nego man named Dennis to her and her
heirs forever also give to my daughter Rebecca Hutchings one nego
girl named Jessie to her and her heirs forever also give to my two
daughters Anis & Rebecca Hutchings one nego woman Grace my
feline boy Daniel & boy Jack to be equally divided between them
and their heirs forever also give to my two daughters above named
one feather bed and furniture apiece to them and their heirs forever also
give to my two daughters two horses one a mare the other a boy to be
equally divided betwix them their heirs also give to my two daughters
five Head of Sheep to be equally divided between them & their heirs also give
to my two daughters all my remaining stock of cattle to be equally
divided to them & their heirs also give to my two daughters my remain-
ing stock of hogs to be equally divided also all my house & kitchen
furniture and implements of husbandry within & without doors
to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever.
I give and bequeath to my son William Hutchings one Rifle gun to
him and his heirs forever also and bequeath to my daughter Margaret
Hatum one nego girl named Jerry during her natural life and after her
death I give the said negro girl an increase to my grandson John Bell
to him & his heirs forever give and bequeath to my daughter Lydia Rags
one nego boy named Jack to her & her heirs forever also give and bequeath
to my son Thomas Hutchings one piece of lands laying to the West
of my sons house and adjoining him a acre & 1/2 of my son William
of my sons house and his heirs forever also appoint my son Thomas
Hutchings my Executor to have sole power in the Management
of my estate in Ratification of the same there unto set my hands
and seal the 25 day of Feb 1824
