

17th In the name of God Amen. I, Joseph Aitchison of Lenoir County
State of North Carolina, being in my perfect mind & memory do make
this Instrument to be my Last will and Testament disannulling all others
Written or Wills. &c.

Item I give unto my son James Aitchison One hundred acres of Land to
be bounded westerly by a Line adjoining the Land of James W. Peeler
Aitchison between by a Line of marked trees, and the same of and to him
and his heirs forever. Also I give unto my son James Aitchison
One hundred acres of Land bounded after the death of my wife Penelope
Aitchison to him and his heirs forever.

Also I give unto my son James Aitchison One hundred acres of Land
now and hereafter lying laid out by a Line of marked trees adjoining the
boundary line of Aitchison, and thereto to a hundred acres of land
between a certain river forever.

Also I give unto my wife Penelope Aitchison One hundred acres of Land
now and hereafter lying the said I mean lies on, together with the house, & all
the furniture, & household goods belonging thereto, and also a negro
boy & a negro girl to be named Peter & Lucy, and also
Little Lamb, Lucy and the use of Little Lamb for twelve years, and so
during her natural life, and at the expiration of the twelve years, my wife
to have Old Lucy shall be set free. Also Give to my wife Penelope
furniture, the feather bed and furniture, One hundred Dollars and one
hundred pieces of money, and as for my other children, to be named
Nicholson, Hannah, Sarah, David, Taylor, Smith, John, Henry, given
them all the same as I intended for them, he and my wife is then my
daughter, who shall have the negro girl Lucy after the death of my
wife, & my desire is that my back cedar Land, that I bought of Joseph
Nicholson to be sold to pay my debts, & to support my wife & family of
James and appoint my beloved wife Penelope Aitchison, Committee besides
and William Remmey executors to this my Last will and Testaments,
In witness whereof I have signed & set my hand seal this tenth of
March in the year 1805.

299. In the name of God Amen. I, Obadiah West of the State of North Carolina,
Lenoir County, being very sick & weak of body but of perfect mind & memory
do make to Almighty God, for if and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die,
Do make this to be my Last will and Testament, first I commend my soul into
the hands of Almighty God, that gave it, and my body I leave it to be
Buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of my executors, and for my worldly
estate as it has pleased God, to bless me, with in this life, I give & dispose of the
following sum, and manner. In the first place I direct that the slaves in
the house, should be Lent to market and applied to paying my debts, and
then I leave as much of my Land on the landward end, to be sold together
with with my wife and Great Scott Brown, as will pay the balance of
my just debts. Also I leave the rest of the balance of my Land, together
with all the remainder of my estate to my wife Elizabeth West
During her continuall and life, Also after her marriage or death of my
wife, I give to my four sons Edward, Obadiah, James and John, West.
All the remainder of my Land, to be equally divided between them
Edward and three heirs forever. Also I give to my two daughters Anna
and Hanning West all the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between
them, to them and their heirs forever, also I constitute and Ordain Edward
West, my sole and sole executor, to this my Last will and Testaments.
In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of February
One thousand eighteen hundred and seven.
