

The Last Will and Testament of Henry Beasley,
deceased Proved at August Term 1824

My last will and testament, in the name of God amen,
I Henry Beasley of the state of North Carolina and County
of Currituck, being in my proper senses and right under
standing, do in the first place request so much of my
movable property sold at public Auction as will satisfy
my just and lawful debts after which I bind all my
lands and tenements and movable property to my widow
during her life time or widowhood. my further request
is that my executor divide my land in two equal
parts commencing at the oak Tree at the meeting
house running west by the south side of the road
to Joseph Grimes lands line the north part to be
equally divided between Rebecca & Lydia line running
East & west the south part to belong to Rebecca and
her heirs forever, the North part to Lydia and her
heirs forever. The South part of the first division is to
be divided commencing at the youth girt of Rebecca's
line and running south as far as the Walnut tree
standing on the road, so west to the yard fence
line, said place is to be equally divided by and East
and west line between Betsy and the unborn child
whether it should be a male or female and Betsy
to have the north part joining on Rebecca
or her heirs forever and the unborn in the youth
part or its heirs forever and my further request is
that the peace or parcel of Land being and lying
between the walnut tree standing on the public
Highway & running west to Grimes line and
youth to John B. Jones line be sold for my family's
use said peace of Land to be sold by my
executor my further request is that the peace of parcel
of Land that lays joining Dennis Colburn belong
to my son Henry or to his heirs forever - my further
request is that after the death of my widow that Rebecca
has one feather bed which is to be the choice & eight plates
the remainder of my movable property to be prised
and Equally divided amongst my heirs - I furthermore
appoint Dennis Grimes to be my proper & lawful

executor to this my last will and testament, signed

The Last Will and Testament of Peter Dowdy
Exhibited and Proved at August Term 1824

In the name of God amen, I Peter Dowdy of the
State of North Carolina and County of Currituck being
weak in body but of sound mind and memory
Blessed be almighty God for the same, do make and
constitute this to be my last will and testament in
manner and form following viz

- 1st. I give and bequeath to my two sons namely Peter
Dowdy & William Dowdy all of my land to be
equally divided between them at the death of my wife
Sally Dowdy which land she is to have and to
hold securing her life
2. I give to my Grand daughter Lucy Dowdy one bed
and furniture & also one cow and calf her increase also one
churn & wheel
3. I give my daughter Abiah Dowdy one bed and furniture
also one cow & her increase also one wheel
4. I give to Benjamin Dowdy of my neighborhood one cow & cattle
5. I give to my son Peter Dowdy two cows & haying also all
of the Hogs that he has now in possession also one bed
furniture also one colt if brought to perfection
- I give to my son William Dowdy one & her increase also
all of the hogs that I have before given him which he
has in possession, also the hand mill at the death of his
mother also one bed and furniture at the death of his mother
& one chest also 6 stocks of bar also one marble & iron
piper also one gun first choice and han saw

I give to my wife Dolly Dodge all of my personal estate that is not all ready given away after paying my last debt securing her life, then to be equally divided between my daughter & brak Dodge & grand daughter Lucy Dodge to them and their heirs forever.

I leave my wife Dolly Dodge to be my Executrix also I leave James Williams to be one of my Executors as in sealed and delivered in presents of us August the 7th 1824

The Last Will and Testament of Samuel Robinson deceased exhibited & proved at August term 1824

In the name of God amen. I Samuel Robinson of the County of Prince George and State of Virginia, being weak of body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, before be almighty God for the same; do make and publish this my last Will and Testament of testimony in manner and form following to w^tch I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary all my property the goods and chattels except one small Bed and bedstead and one small wheel which I do give and bequeath to my niece Anna; forever. The residue of all my personal estate, goods and chattels I give and bequeath the same to my said beloved wife Mary Whom I hereby appoint sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In virtue whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty three.

The Last Will and Testament of Joseph Jimmions deceased
Exhibited & proved at August Term 1824

In the name of God amen. I Joseph Jimmions being in health in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and that it is appointed for man to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that to say

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julia Jimmions one negro Girl named Dice to her and her heirs forever also one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julia Jimmions one negro girl by the name of Lenny to her and her husband

Item I bind all the use of my property within doors and without to my beloved wife Ann Jimmions during her natural life or widowhood if she considers that is more property than she needs she can sell it on her acct

Item I give and bequeath to my four sons John Jimmions, Monroe Jimmions, Samuel Jimmions and Patrick Jimmions all my land to be equally divided to them and their heirs forever

Item I leave all the property that I leave to my beloved wife Ann Jimmions after death or marriage to be equally divided among all my children except Roselle Jimmions and Lucy Jimmions as I have given them their portion before by Deed and dont intend them to have any more of my property. Last my will and desire is that my beloved wife Ann Jimmions should be and she is hereby appointed and ordained the whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament in witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of June in the year of our Lord 1824
