bed & furniture one horse to him & his heirs
Item The Remainder of my Estate I leave to be equally
divided between my three Children Brook Ball
Samuel Ball & Bridget Forbes and their heirs
I hereby make and ordain my son Brook Ball
Executor of this my last will & testament in witness
whereof I the said Hosea Ball have to this my
Last will and testament set my hand & seal the
day & year above written Hosea Ball sealed

John Gray's son, Benjamin, died in 1882. He was 50 years old. His wife, Anna, died in 1883.

Benjamin Gray's son, John, died in 1900. He was 78 years old. His wife, Anna, died in 1901.

all my land west of the Creek fence running from my
timbered brick house westly even Nathan Poyner's house
also all the woodland land that is eastly of the fence outside
of my plantation.

I give and bequeath to my wife Nancy Ballance all
of my passable estate that I have with all ready given
a way unto her and her lawful heirs for ever I
also find my wife Nancy Ballance all the land
land from the Creek before mentioned eastwardly
with in my boundary to gather with all the houses
during her natural life and then I give after her
death I give unto my son James B. Ballance the said
land which have been to my wife after my
lawful debts are paid together all the rest of my
land I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife
Nancy and John Davis S. G. Executors to this my
last will and testament revoking all former wills
hereunto made witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this the 3rd day of August
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirty three
