was exhibited in open Court at May Term 1832 & proven
by the Bath of Mr. Ball a Notary Publick recorded
In the name of God amens I Thomas Mackhoney of the County of Craven
in the State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of
sound and disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the
uncertainty of human life and that it is appointed for man to die
do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner
and form following viz
Imprimis I give and bequeath to my son Jasper Mackhoney what
he has already received and no more to him & his heirs
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsy Mackhoney one
desk one feather bed and furniture one Cow and Calf to her
Heirs
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julian Fox what she has
already rec'd and no more to her and her heirs
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Peggy Jones what she
has already rec'd and no more to her and her heirs -
Item All the remainder of my Estate within doors & without I leave
to my beloved wife Bridget Mackhoney during her single
life and then to be divided between my two daughters
Sarah Mackhoney and Bridget Mackhoney and if my
wife Bridget Mackhoney sees fit to marry at her
marriage the property I leave to my wife Bridget to be
divided in three equal parts one part to my wife one
part to my daughter Sarah Mackhoney and the other part
my daughter Bridget Mackhoney and their Heirs
Lastly my Will and desire is that my dear and trusty
friend Enoch Ball is hereby appointed constituted &
ordained whole & sole Executor to this my last will
and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and first my seal this 28th day of November 1832

The Last Will and Testament of Polly Shaw deceased
Exhibited in open Court at Greeley Term 1832 & proven
by the Bath of Daniel Sanderson Esq. & then B. Sanderson
Attorney, King's & The Executor duly qualified & recorded Recopied
In the name of God Amens I Polly Shaw of the County of -
Craventuck & State of North Carolina Being of sound and
perfect memory helped by God do this day the 2nd day of July
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty
two make and publish this my last will and testament in the
manner as follows
First I give and bequeath to my dear beloved husband Robert
Shaw four negroes namely one negro man by the name of
Dewey and one by the name of Bo and a negro girl by
the name of Harriett a negro woman by the name of Phebe my
two grey horses and new carriage a large bed & furniture also
a theater boxsted below stairs on his choice of the beds
a bove stairs and I give him my husband his year provision
for him and his family to be laid ~~out~~ by them disinterited son if he
wouldly I give and bequeath to my son James Sanderson one negro man
by the name of Sam one negro woman by the name of ~~Sarah~~
Sarah and one negro woman by the name of Lydia one
feather bed and furniture half dozen Chairs & one secretary
and Book case
Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Sanderson one
negro man by the name of Ridge one boy by the name of
Martin and one negro woman by the name of Anna and
two feather beds & furniture one clock one sideboard and
the furniture on it half dozen large silver ^{tobacco} spoons and
half dozen silver tea spoons and a silver cup -
Thirdly I give and bequeath to Betsy Sanderson daughter of
General Sanderson one feather bed and furniture one blue
Chick half dozen flowered ~~bosome~~ Chairs -
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my worthy friend Mary Taylor one
large blue chest & twenty dollars to be paid out of residue of
my estate
Fifthly I give and bequeath to my niece Margaret Nash 2/5
dollars in cash to be paid out the residue of my estate
Sixthly I give and bequeath to my nephew Isaac Nash fifty dollars in cash
to be paid out the residue of my estate
Eighthly I give to my old negro man Sam five dollars a year for ever
year as long as he lives and for it to be paid by my husband
John A. Shaw to James Sanderson on my son Thomas Sanderson
And lastly for the crop now commenced to be carried on by my
husband J. A. Shaw and for the negroes I have given away
to remain on the farm with my husband until the first
day of next January to tend the crop & and then for

The Crop to be divided one half I give to my Husband J.A.
Shaw and the other half to be sold and equally divided
between my two sons James & Thomas.

And I leave all the residue which I have not given away of
my estate to be sold to pay off my just debts and what more
which was given to County Woodhouse and signed by my
husband J.A. and then I should have no residue of
my estate I leave it to be equally divided between my
Husband J.A. Shaw and my son James & Thomas.

And I hereby make and ordain my dear beloved husband
John A. Shaw Executor of this my last will & Testament
in witness whereof I the said Polly Shaw have this day
my last will and testament set my hand and seal
the day and date above written

ordained to be Recorded

In the name of God amen I Seven Danton of Berwick
County being of sound and perfect mind and memory before
the God so this 20th day of November in the year of our Lord
1832 make and publish this my Last will and Testa-
ment in manner following that is to say

First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Polly Danton
the negro woman named Bridget one Negro boy
named George and one negro girl named Lucy one
feather bed & furniture one chest one wheel one table
six stool chairs one horses cart and horse if I have any
one Cow & Calf to her and her heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Walker one
negro girl named Grace and his insects also one negro
girl named Sarah to her and her heirs

Item I lend to Maria Wallace during his natural life
one tract of Land known by the name of the Robinson tract
and one half of my new patent swamp Land and at his
death to be equally divided between his four Sons Bartholomew
David Lewis and Dennis to him and their heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my two Grand Daughters Emily
Wallace and Maria Wallace one negro girl Abigail and
increas to them and their heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son Dennis Danton one
tract of Land where on I formerly lived known by the name
of the White tract and one half of my new Patent swamp
Land one negro boy named Jeffry one feather bed and
furniture one table one chest and set of stool chairs to
him and his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julia Payner one
negro girl named Rachel and increases one negro girl named

Zim and one negro man named Cuffee to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son David Danton one negro
boy named Jack one negro girl named Hamet and
increas one tract of Land and that I bought of Robert
Wolfe out of the old patent to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son Alexander Danton
one negro boy named Spencer one negro girl named
Sophie and three hundred dollars in cash one feather bed
and furniture one set of stool chairs and one Table
to him and his heirs
