Ball a sworn Juror recorded Recorded in the name of God Amen Thomas Mackhorney of the County of Currituck in the State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and that it is appointed for man to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following viz

Item I give and bequeath to my son Jasper Mackhorney what he has already received and no more to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsy Mackhorney one sick one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf to her heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julian what she has already Rec^d and no more to her and her heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Peggy Jones what she has already Rec^d and no more to her and her heirs

Item All the remainder of my Estate within doors & without I Give to my beloved wife Bridget Mackhorney during her single life and then to be divided between my two daughters, Mary Mackhorney and Bridget Mackhorney and if my wife Bridget Mackhorney shall fit to marry at her marriage the property I Give to my wife Bridget to be divided in three equal parts one part to my wife one part to my daughter Mary Mackhorney and the other part my daughter Bridget Mackhorney and their heirs

Lastly my Will and desire is that my true and Trusty friend Enoch Ball is hereby appointed constituted & ordained whole sole Executor to this my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and sign my seal this 28th day of November 1832

The Last Will and Testament of Polly Shaw dead was exhibited in open Court at May Term 1832 & proven by the oath of Daniel Curdley for Edw.athan & Curdley Jurors & the Executors Ensign & ordered Recorded

In the name of God Amen I Polly Shaw of the County of Currituck State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect memory helped be had do this day the 28th day of Feb^y in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two make and publish this my last will and testament in the manner as follows

First I give and bequeath to my dear beloved husband Esmer Shaw four negroes namely one negro man by the name of Ben and one by the name of Jo and a negro girl by the name of Harriett a negro woman by the name of Phyllis

two grey horses and new Carriage a large bed & furniture and a plaster bedstead below stairs on his choice of the beds a horse stairs and I give him my husband and his years provision for him and his family to be paid by three disinterested good persons Secondly I give and bequeath to my son James Sanderson one negro man by the name of Sam one negro woman by the name of Sarah and one negro woman by the name of Sudah one feather bed and furniture half dozen chairs & one secretary and book case

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Sanderson one negro man by the name of Rodge one boy by the name of Martin and one negro woman by the name of Phane and two feather beds & furniture one clock one sideboard and the furniture on it half dozen large silver ^{table} spoons and half dozen silver tea spoons and a silver cup

Fourthly I give and bequeath to Polly Sanderson daughter of Samuel Sanderson one feather bed and furniture one blue chest half dozen flowered ~~chairs~~ chairs

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my worthy friend Mary Taylor one large blue chest & twenty dollars to be paid out of residue of my estate

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my niece Margaret Nash fifty dollars in cash to be paid out the residue of my estate

Seventhy I give and bequeath to my nephewess Nash fifty dollars in cash to be paid out the residue of my estate

Eighthly I give to my old negro man Sam five dollars a year for men year as long as he lives and for it to be paid by my husband to him & Shaw some Sanderson on my son Thomas Sanderson

And lastly for the crop now commenced to be carried on by my husband & I Shaw and for the negroes I have given away to remain on the farm with my husband until the first day of next January to lend the crop &c and then for

the crop to be divided one half I give to my husband I & A Shaw and the other half to be sold and equally divided between my two sons James & Thomas

And I leave all the residue which I have not given away of my estate to be sold to pay all my just debts and that note which was given to Emily Woodhouse and signed by my husband I & A and then should there be any residue of my estate I leave it to be equally divided between my husband I & A Shaw and my son James & Thomas

And I hereby make and ordain my dear beloved husband John I & A Shaw Executor of this my last will & testament in witness whereof I the said Polly Shaw have to my my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and date above written

In the Name of God amen I Samuel Eddy being sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for man to die do make and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following — Impremise after just debts is paid I give and bequeath all the remainder of my property consisting of land stock and house hold ^{property} to my beloved wife Julia Eddy & her heirs.

Lastly I hereby constitute appoint and ordain my beloved wife Julia Eddy whole Executrix this my last will & Testament December the 19th day 1831

The Last Will and Testament of Seven Danton does was Exhibited in open Court at Fells Term 1833 and Proven by the oath of Joshua Ball a witness thereto The Executor herein named qualified and is ordered to be Recorded

In the Name of God amen I Seven Danton of Cornhill County being of sound and perfect mind and memory bless be God do this 20th day of November in the year of our Lord 1832 make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say

First I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Polly Danton the negro woman named Bridget one negro boy named George and one negro girl named Sidney one feather bed & furniture one chest one wheel oak table six stool chairs one horse cart and horse if I have any one cow & calf to her and her and her heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Patsy Walker one negro girl named Grace and her inches also one negro girl named Sarah to her and her heirs

Item I lend to Wm B. Wallace during his natural life one tract of land known by the name of the Robinson tract and one half of my new patent swamp land and at his death to be equally divided between his four sons Bartholomew David Lewis and Dennis to them and their heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my two grand daughters Enla Wallace and Meriah Wallace one negro girl Abigail and increase to them and their heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son Dennis W. Danton one tract of land where on I formerly lived known by the name of the White tract and one half of my new Patent swamp land one negro boy named Jeffery one feather bed and furniture one table one chest and set of stool chairs to him and his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julia Dwyer one negro girl named Rachel and increase one negro girl named Jim and one negro man named Leffer to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son David Danton one negro boy named Jack one negro girl named Hannah and increase one tract of Blank land that I bought of Robert White out of the old patent to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my son Alexander Danton one negro boy named Spence one negro girl named Sophy and three hundred dollars in cash one feather bed and furniture one set of stool chairs and one table to him and his heirs
