and Negro Woman called Nita and enowes to be equally Divided
between the Children at the coming to age of Susan Chapman
them and their heirs forever.

I Give to my Son in law Thomas Gregory and Director
Gregory his Wife the Land whereon they now live as long as
they live on the same and in case they move off their Land
my Will and Desire is that my son Nathan Hall shall
have the Possession of the said Land until Sarah Gregory comes to age
or marries.

I Give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Sarah
Gregory fifty acres of Land beginning at Nathan Hall's
with Line and running with said Line to the Headline
and as far Northwesterly as will make fifty acres to her and
her heirs forever. And in case Sarah Gregory should die
before she comes to age or marries my Will and desire is
that the Land above given to Sarah Gregory should go and
descend to Spence Hall Gregory to him and his heirs forever.

I Give to my Daughter Director Gregory and my son in law
Thomas Gregory one Negro Woman named Dinah after the death
of her Mother Director Hall, and after the death of Director
Gregory the said Negro and increase to go and descend to Spence
Hall Gregory to him and his heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Director Gregory and
my Son in law Thomas Gregory thirty Silver Dollars.

My Will and desire is that after the Death of my Wife Director
Hall that the hole of my Estate that is not given away shall be
Equally Divided among all my Children (namely) Nathaniel
Mary White Nathan Hall Spence Hall Director Gregory to them
and their heirs forever.

I do nominate and appoint my beloved Wife Director Hall
and my sons Nathan Hall and Spence Hall my heirs and
Executors to this my last Will and Testament in witness
hereof I have unto set my hand and Seal this
Seventh

of Body and perfect mind and Memory thanks be giving
unto God calling unto Mind the Mortality of my Body
and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to die
do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
that is to say principally and first of all I Give and recommend
my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God that gave it and my
Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian
Burial at the Discretion of my Executors: Nothing doubting
but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the Mighty Power of God. And as Touching such
Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
in this life, I Give devise and dispose of the same in the following
Manner and Form: I Give I leave to my well beloved Wife
Mary Burrows fifty acres of Land and house wheron I now
live with all my Household Goods and Negro Wench named
Rachel Likewise my Horse hinds cattle hogs and Sheeps
during her Widowhood. Also I Give to my Son John Burrows
Twenty five Acres of the North end of my Land that I leave to his
Mother during her Widowhood. Also I Give to my Son
William Burrows the other Twenty five Acres of the above
Land. Also I Give to my Son John Burrows fifty acres
of Land lying between Kinnelab and Chicknucumack be-
ginning at the North end of Edward Lamborough Line and run-
ning Northwesterly Course. Also I Give to my Son William Burrows
Fifty Acres of Land joining William third by Lane Schuauas
my Body to be equally divided between my two Sons
John Burrows and William Burrows Likewise all
that I have left to my Wife Mary Burrows during her
Widowhood after I Give to my two Children John Burrows
William

to mind the nearness of this life and to being Ordained
for All Men to die I do make and Ordain this Instrument

ling all other Wills and Testaments before made by me
either by Word or Writing and this only to be taken as my

in convenient time after my Decease, my Will and desire is that
my loving Wife Barbary I give and bequeath all the Property that
I have to her and her heirs Lawfully begot of her Body forever, with-
out Reservations. And I also constitute and Appoint my
loving Wife Barbary and my friend Nina Harrison my heirs
sole Executors to this my last Will and Testament to settle all my
business according to this my last Will and Testament and as the
Law shall require, as Witness my hand and Seal this 27 Day of
October in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
Eighty Nine.
