I give and bequeath to the Children of Director Grigory
a Negro Woman and her children to be equally Divided
between the Children at the coming to age of Nathan Hall
them and their heirs forever.

I send to my Sonon law Thomas Grigory and Director
Grigory his wife the land whereon they now live alongas
they live on the same and in case they move off the said land
my will and desire is that my son Nathan Hall shall
take posse of the said land until Sarah Grigory comes to age
or marries.

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Sarah
Grigory fifty acres of Land beginning at Nathan Hall -
With Line and running with said Line to the Headline
and as far Northwardly as will make fifty acres to her and
her heirs forever; And in case Sarah Grigory should die
before she comes to age or marries my will and desire is -
that the Land above given to Sarah Grigory should go and
descend to Spence Hall Grigory to him and his forever.

I send to my Daughter Director Grigory and my Son in law
Thomas Grigory one Negro woman named Diner after the death
of her Master Director Hall, and after the death of Director
Grigory the Negro and increase to go and descend to Spence
Hall Grigory to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Director Grigory and
my Son in law Thomas Grigory thirty Silver Dollars
At coming Will and desire is that after the Death of the Director
Hall that the hole of my Estate that is not given away shall be
Equally Divided among all my Children Namely Willoughby
White, Nathan Hall, Spence Hall, Director Grigory, others
and their heirs forever.

To nominate and appoint my beloved wife Director Hall
and my Sons Nathan Hall and Spence Hall my holde and
executors to this my last Will and Testament in witness
whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this

Robbards Banker of Cape Hatteras. I am in perfect health
of Body and perfect mind and therefore thank God for giving
unto me calling unto Mind the Mortality of my Body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die
do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
that is to say principally land and forest of all I give and recommend
my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my
Body I command to the earth to be buried in decent Christian
Burial at the Discretion of my Executors. Nothing doubting
but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the Mighty Power of God. And as touching such
Worldly Estate wherewith to live I thank God to be poor
in this life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the following
Manner and form: First I give to my well beloved wife -
Mary Burrowes fifty acres of Land and house wherein I now
live with all my Household Goods and Negro Mench named
Rachel Likewise my Horse hounds cattle hogs and Sheep
During her Midewhood Also I give to my son John Burrowes
Twenty five acres of the North end of my Land that I have to his
Mother during her Midewhood. Also I give to my son
William Burrowes the other Twenty five Acres of the aforesaid
Land. Also I give to my son John Burrowes fifty acres
of Land lying between Remkeh and Chicknemacke be-
gining at the North end of Edward Lanborough Lanes corner
a Northwesterly corner. Also I give to my son William Burrowes
Fifty acres of Land joining William and by Lene Lekeus
my Books to be equally divided between my two Sons
John Burrowes and William Burrowes Likewise all
that I have left to my wife Mary Burrowes during her
Midewhood, after I give to my four children John, William,

William Brown & Brown and Elizabeth Brown
to be equally divided between them. I likewise constitute
make and Ordain Philetus Brown and my son John
Brown Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament.
And I do hereby utterly disavow all reoche and disown all and
every other former Testaments Wills Legacies Requests
Executors by me in any ways before named. Will and beque-
athed notwithstanding and confirming this and no other to be my last
Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal this Twenty fifth day of June in the year
of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and forty one
and sealed published & affirmed by

divided between Elizabeth Howard, Mary Smith & Barbara
with my other fixtures there.

Give unto my Deas and Associate Father John Smith
the Remaining part of my Estate. I After this publishing
With lead, Father John Smith my hole and Sole Executor
Publishing this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
in this place whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this Day and year above mentioned signed sealed published
Promised and declared by the said Sarah Smith a Notary
Public Will & Testament in the presence of us the witnesses
Sarah Clark & Daniel Sarah Smith & Daniel

I have to her and her heirs lawfully begot of her Body forever, with-
out Reservation. And I also constitute and Appoint my
loving Wife Barbry and my friend Anna Harrison my herein
Sole Executrix to this my last Will and Testament to settle all my
business according to this my last Will and Testament and as the
Law shall require, as witness my hand and seal this 5th Day of
October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
