Before His Majesty's Justices

The Testimony of Richard Fanshawe having been taken & there  
present and the Executors qualified in due form and ordered to be required  
accordingly it is and here followeth in verba viz.

I Being in perfect health and of sound memory and in my proper senses  
do hereby my last Will and Testimony bearing date and Describing <sup>part of</sup> former Will  
and mine whatsoever first I gave my sole that I gave it me and my Body to  
be Buried at the Discretion of my Executors.

I have I Give and bequeath to my beloved son Thomas Fanshawe the western part of  
my Plantation from the western line to a branch that makes out of a beaver  
dam and along the said Branch to a slope marked Gum to bark and his heirs  
forever

I have I Give and bequeath to my beloved son James Fanshawe that part  
of my Plantation that and Land that I now live on from y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid branch  
to the williams is line that his son William now lives on to him and his heirs  
forever — and in case my son James Fanshawe ever Deserted of both right  
of the aforesaid land by Deed or Grant he give and bequeath to my son  
James Fanshawe thirty one acres of land on a Ridge known and called  
Cock hall where I formerly lived on

I have I Give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Mary Mon Croft all Moneys to wit  
Money of Great Breckton to her and her heirs for ever

I have my will and Desire is that after my last debts and legacies is paid that the best of  
the both personal and real be equally Divided between Thomas Fanshawe  
James Fanshawe James Heaton Thomas Mervett Margaret Fanshawe and  
Cuthbert Fanshawe and their Heirs

I have I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Knight two Milleing Horses to  
her and her heirs for ever

Further I appoint my friend William Williams and the my Executor John Thomas  
Fanshawe my sole and true Executors of this my last will and  
Testament as will keep my hand and seal this fifth day of August  
one thousand seven hundred and sixty
