





In the name of God, AMEN. I Robert Poyner of the County of
Currituck and State of North Carolina, being in health at this present, and
desirous of making my last will and Testament, in the uncertainty of my
life, and minded to make this my last will and Testament, in the
following manner, sprung. I give and bequeath to my daughter
Barbara Poyner, one negro by name Pleasant and her child, by
name Jack, and all her increase from this date, also two negroes
girls by name Fibby and Amy, and their increase, to her and
her heirs forever. Item. I bind unto my beloved wife Mary Poyner
one negro man by name James, also one negro woman by name
Francis, during her natural life, and after her decease, I give the
aforesaid negroes, James and Francis, to my daughter Barbara
Poyner, and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my
daughter Barbara, together the one half of my personal estate, that
shall be remaining, at my decease, within doors and without doors of
what kind or nature soever, to her and her heirs forever. Item.
I give the other half of my personal estate, that shall be remaining
at my decease, to my beloved wife Mary Poyner, that is within
and without doors of what kind or nature soever, to her and her
heirs forever. Item. I bind the use and benefit of six bushels of my
land and plantation, to be equally divided by a line straight
line east and west, to contain my dwelling house and other
out houses, to my beloved wife Mary Poyner, during her natural
life and no longer. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter
Barbara Poyner the whole of my land and plantation, whereon I
now live, after the decease of my wife Mary, to her and her
heirs forever. Item. My will and desire is that if my daughter
Barbara Poyner should die without lawful issue, that the whole of
the property both real and personal, that were divided to
Barbara Poyner, to go to Julia Phillips, wife of Samuel
Phillips, and her heirs forever. Lastly, I constitute, nominate
and appoint my beloved wife Mary, whole and sole executor
to this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and annul-
ling of all other wills or wills by me made from the date of
these presents. In witness whereof I have affixed my hand and
seal at Currituck the 2^d of April, anno Domini 1804.—

IN the name of God, AMEN. The tenth day of May in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen. I Solomon Miller of the
State North Carolina, in the county of Currituck, being in a low state of
health and weak in body, but in sound mind and perfect memory, shall
bequeath unto god, hereof calling unto mind the mortality of my body,
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain
this my last will and Testament, that is to say, Principally and First of
all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God, that gave
it; and for my body, I command it to the earth to be buried in a Christian
and decent like manner, at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubt-
ing but at General resurrection, I shall a joyful receive the same, by the
mighty power of god, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith
it hath pleased god to bless me with in this life. I give and divide
and dispose of the same in manner and form following.
In�pining. It is my will, and I do ordain that in the first place shall my
just debts and funeral charges be paid and satisfied. Item. I bind
my beloved wife Polly Miller, two feather beds of the first choice, during
her life or widowhood, and afterwards to be divided equally between
my two youngest children, namely John Miller and Polly Miller.
Item. I bind to my beloved wife Polly Miller, two chests, and two
lions, a spinning wheel, and a loom, and furniture, and
fourteen head of sheep, and three cows and calves, and one heifer of the
first choice, three pigs of the first choice, and a team of hogs, and one mare
by the name of Starling, also all of my corn and pork that is now laid
in for the families use, also all the kitchen furniture, also all the horses
and macks, and spoons, also three stocks of beef, also all theదeemed stock,
also all the flax in the straw, and all the cotton in the seed, all these articles
after my beloved wife's death or widowhood is to be sold, and equally di-
vided between my two youngest children, namely John and Polly Miller.
Item. I give and bequeath one house by the name of Bittles to my
son William Miller, also two feather beds, and one set of furniture, that
he has now in possession, one chest, also one safe, one pot of potashmuds,
also two axes, also two cows and calves. Item. I bind to my beloved wife
Polly Miller, during her life or widowhood, one hand mill, and after
her death or widowhood, I give it to my son William Miller for ever,
also. I bind to my beloved wife Polly Miller, during her life or widow-
hood one pair of carding combs, also one pair of cart wheels, also all my plows
and hoes, and axes, and all the empty barrels, also all the sitting
chairs. The rest of my stock and property both in doors and out doors, I
leave to be sold, and after all my just debts is paid, the money to be
equally divided between my two youngest children, namely John
and Polly Miller. Lastly, I nominate, constitute and appoint Dennis
Simmons, my whole and sole executor, to this my last Will and Testa-
ment, see the same done and performed. In testimony whereof
hereunto set my hand and fix my seal.
