

My will and desire is that if either of the negroes given in this will to Augustus b. Bough, William b. Bough and Mary Bough should die before Mary Bough comes of age then and in that case the person that these negroes die before Mary Bough comes of age, to have a negro boy by the name of Obed, but in case neither of these negroes die before Mary Bough comes of age then the 4 and negro ^{named} Obed to be equally divided between Augustus b. Bough, William b. Bough and Mary Bough. otherwise said negro Obed if any reference to be paid out of my estate by my executors then after named and if said negro should be any profit before my daughter comes of age if the negro is divided among my three children then the profit also to be divided equal, but if the negro should go to either of them by one of these negroes dying then the profit also to go with of said negro

I then give unto my two sons Augustus b. Bough, William b. Bough and my daughter Mary Bough one old negro woman named Abiah one negro woman named Calo also two feather beds and furniture one horse named paroled one round yellow table six Windsor sitting chairs and one rocking chair and harness to them and their heirs

My will and desire is that after my decease my executors hereafter named sell all the remainder of my estate not given away in this will for six months credit and after my debts are paid, all the remainder part of my estate of what kind or nature is ever I give unto my two sons Augustus b. Bough, William b. Bough and my daughter Mary Bough to be equally divided among them & their heirs. —

Lastly I appoint Thomas Poyner your my whole & sole executor to this my last will and testament and in case he should depart this life before and or not qualify as executor, then in either case above mentioned I appoint Caleb Forbe Esqr to act as my executor — In witness whereof I the said Richard Bough hath hereunto set my hand and seal this day of 1802

The Last Will and Testament of S. S. D. Powers deceased Exhibited and proved at May Term 1805

In the name of God Amen or be remembered that I John S. D. Powers of the State of Carolina, Currituck County being weak in body but of sound mind and memory blessed be God for the Father I do make this day this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Susannah Powers all the provisions belonging to me at my death consisting of corn pork beef peatons and tallow of all sorts one my dringill and fish also all my stock of sheep also one horse by the name of Bob and one mare by the name of Blase also one head first stage also all my Powed also all my kitchen furniture consisting of Pots plates dishes spoons cups Dishes and all meisters also my chest also all my property I also give one part of my land next at the main road, beginning at a chimney post along the fence next to the beach swamp running to the end of a ditch thence down said ditch straight to the land that I bought of Jonathan McCoy, also one half of my stock of cattle the first choice also one hand mill and three chews and harnes also I give and bequeath unto my son Moses B. Powers one part of my land beginning at a black gum in the edge of the Syprus swamp running straight to the end of a ditch that is now in my opinion thence down that ditch straight to the land that I bought of Jonathan McCoy thence down that line to the main road also one feather bed that he has now in possession also one horse and cart by the name of Rock I also give unto my son S. S. David Powers one piece of Land beginning at a black gum in the edge of the Syprus swamp thence running straight to a mature apple tree thence down the apple tree now to the main road thence strale to William Mathias line or as to give S. S. David Powers one hundred and three acres also one place and one meat by the name of gun and two cows and calves also I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Bough a mare woman three dollars in cash to be paid out of my estate I also give and bequeath unto my grandson George Washington Powers one piece of Land beginning at a chimney post near my Gate in the edge of the ditch thence to William Mathias back line thence down said ditch as line to David Spences Mathias's thence along his line to David Spences corner maple thence along said Spences line to Edward Gents corner maple thence along said Gents line to the main road thence along the main road to the first station post above Cow by the name of comfort also I give and bequeath unto my grand son John S. C. Powers the other part of Land where I now live one also one heffer by the name of pleaser also I give and bequeath unto my grandson Newton S. Powers the

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part of Land that my own more B. Powers now lives on and
and Heffer by the name of Planting - If there is any other
things left out that is not number I give last of all the
remainder to my loving wife Keturah Powers Last I appoint
my worthy friend Matthias Etheridge my Lawful Executor to
be my last will and testament to his act nothing all the
wills by me made to the present date

ordain this my last will and testament. Hereby revoking
and annulling all former wills hitherto by me made either
by word or written and this to be taken for my last will and
no other. - First my will and desire is that all my just
debts be paid -

Secondly I give and bequeath to my beloved son Thomas
Cox the tract of Land whereon I now live to him and his heirs
forever adjoining Henry Ballentine's line beginning at a
black Oak then a straight line to a maple thence to
a marked gum then a strait along the back line -

Also I give and bequeath to my son Edward Cox the tract
of Land he now lives upon adjoining said Thomas Cox's
line to him and his heirs forever I also give and bequeath
to my son John Cox fifteen acres of light swamp lands
adjoining Wilson's line and James Garretts line also fifty
acres of swampy land adjoining the old swamp bridge
on the left hand side. also fifty acres of the same tract
to my son Thomas Cox - also fifty acres of the same
tract ~~more or less~~ to my Grandson David Cox the son
of my son David Cox - also fifty acres of the same tract
more or less to my son Edward Cox the and their heirs forever
Also I give to my son John Cox one negro woman
named Merriam

Also I give to my grand son John Jordan Ballentine
one negro boy named Luthie. also I give a negro woman named Phillis
her increase to my three grand daughters. Matilda Ballen-
tine, Minerva Ballentine and Lovey Ballentine the son and
daughters of my daughter Sarah Allason - I also give and
bequeath to my daughter Fanny Bowen one negro woman
named Sale and all her increase also a negro girl named
Suskey to her and her posterity. I also give and bequeath
to my beloved daughter Frances the sum of a negro girl
named Bridget to her and her heirs forever. I also give
one negro man named Simon to be Equally divided
between my beloved sons John Cox and Thomas Cox.
I give to my son Edward Cox one negro man named Sam
to him and his heirs forever and all my household
furniture and stock of all kinds to be sold and the
money to be Equally divided between John Cox
Thomas Cox, Edward Cox David Cox my grand son
Sarah Allason Fanny Bowen and Frances Bowen
Lastly I do appoint and nominate my son John
Cox my sole and sole Executor to this my last
will and Testament in witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 17th of
February 1825
