Two thirds thereof and the remander unto Peggy Hammond.

Signed this my hand this 26th day of October 1802

III. In the name of God amen I Sam Lee, of the County of Franklin  
Being in a low state of Health, but a sound mind and disposing  
Memory, I give to God, using unto me the mortality of my  
Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do  
Make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is  
To say principally and first, of all I give and recommend my soul  
into the hands of almighty God, that gave it and my body I  
Recommend to the care of the Earth to be buried in a quiet Christian  
Burial at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at  
the general resurrection, that I shall revive the same again  
By the mighty power of god, and as touching such worldly estate  
Wherewith it hath pleased God, to bless me in this world, I give  
And divide and dispose of the same in the following manner  
Item I give and bequeath to my son Michael Lee the  
Plantation, and land wherein he now lives, as it is better and convenient  
for his use to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Catharine Colridge one feather  
Bed and furniture, one Cow and Calf, one Gun two Head of Sheep one  
Sheep one Lamb and pigs, some Cups ware, to her heirs forever.  
I give to my daughter Catharine Colridge, two Cows and one Calf one  
Sheep, two Iron Pots, three Pans and nine Sheets, three Pewter plates,  
one Basin and Pewter dish, to one Cup and all belonging to the  
Pew, to one Cupboard and all my earthen ware, one Grind Stone and  
all my Hoes, as a three Head of Sheep and my Tools, and one  
Hunting pistol and all my Cups ware, and all belon to one board  
and two Heaters, and some Lush bottles, and one Dining cabinet  
and all my Sitting Chairs, and two small Stoves and all my Son  
and Tools, to her and her heirs forever.

I give to my daughter Catharine Colridge one Large Cannon, and  
My Son's Pot bellied and one good Pot and one Gill Pot, and one  
Cup Pot, to her forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Philip Lee all the rest  
of land except the tract is my son Michael Lee, which was before  
Mentioned to him and his heirs forever. I leave the rest of all  
the land that I have given to my son Philip Lee to my daughter  
Catharine Colridge ten years. I do ordain and appoint my son  
Philip Lee and wife Catharine Executors to this my last will and testament.

all my ready money and one negro man named Coffey  
With all and singular the rest of my property of every sort  
During of her natural life, and then to an Airport off of the following  
Vesture, and first of all I Give an a bequest to my wife  
Pedro children Sarah, Mary, Thomas, Christian, Richard  
Laydson, John, Ruth any six hundred and forty acres of  
land laying on Long shoal river, to be equally divided  
betwix them also I Give an a bequest to my daughter  
Mary one Negro woman named Ruth, and two boys named  
Jack and John Drew, also I Give and bequeath to my  
Grand son Benjamin Daniel one Negro girl  
named Charney also I Give and bequeath to my son Thomas  
One negro boy named Samus, also I Give to my daughter  
Christian one negro girl named Ruth, also I Give to my  
son Richard one Negro woman named Rachel  
also I Give to my son John one negro girl named Hitty  
also I Give to my daughter Ruth and in the course thereof

Also I Give to my Grand son David Page one acre of ground  
named West also I Give to my Grand son Thomas Page  
One negro boy named Boston also Give to my other son  
Thomas Richard son John one negro man named Tom  
also I Give to my daughter Ruth any of that piece of land whereon  
she now lives beginning at the said Middle line to the Great  
Tree running then East eleven degrees South to the sea side  
Also I Give to my son John at three of land whereon  
he now lives from the Great Survey tree to the Great tree  
at the Old School house running then East eleven degrees South  
To the sea side also I Give to my Grand son Thomas Page  
Richard son John a piece of land wherein he now lives from the  
Great oak at the School house to the Vain pole oak running  
then east eleven degrees South to the sea side also I Give to my  
Grand son Thomas Page piece of land from the Bain pole  
Oak to sand dress then east eleven degrees touch to the sea side  
Also I Give to my son Richard son John a piece of land from  
the said oak tree to my North line skin east to the sea side  
also I Give to my son Thomas set piece of land wherein he now  
lives East running one hundred and one fifty acres also I Give to my  
son Thomas Richard son John all my land on Cape Patterson to be  
equally divided among them also I Give to my three sons Thomas  
Richard son John all my water Rappages also I Give to my  
daughter Ruth any one man Red flower also I Give to my  
Grand son Thomas Page one acre and forty and three  
Heads of cattle and one gun also I Give to my children Sarah  
Mary Thomas Christian Richard son John Ruth any all my  
Lock of every kind to be divided equally among them also I  
Give to my son Thomas Richard son John and Ruth any a  
Sheath box a gun also I Give to my three sons Thomas Richard  
son John all and singular my property to be equally divided  
among them and constitute & make my three sons Thomas Richard  
son John the sole executors of this my last will & testament and  
I give hereby utterly disallow, rescind & disannul all former former  
testaments wills, legacies bequests & testators by me in any way before  
named, called, or bequeathed, ratify the and confirm this my other to be  
My last will & testament on a day when I have been  
My hand & seal the 15<sup>th</sup> day of Oct 1798. Thomas Page  
My attorney present.
