Men once to die and as I am Possessed of Some Small Property
Do wish to divide it between my two daughters Sally Hammond &
Margaret Hammond, in Manner and form following—
Viz I Give unto Sally one large Chest I Give unto Peggy
One middle Sizer trunk also one Quilt trunk also two
Looking Glasses, one large drinking Glass, every of the remainder
of my Property I desire wish to have sold for the purpose of discharging
My Just Contracts, and the surplus to be estimated giving Sally
Two thirds thereof and the remainder unto Peggy Hammond,
to them and their heirs forever In witness whereof I have
Recorded at my hand this 26th day of October, 1802.

I have my desire is that Mary Hammond be paid five
Shillings out of my Property as her full dower, and more
than she deserves, and I further nominate and appoint
My friend John Williams Esq. my true and lawful Executor
To this my last will and Testament, watching all other
my Guardian to my two daughters—

III. In the Name of God Amen I Saml Lee of the County of Cumberland
Being in a low State of Health, but a sound mind and desiring
My Body be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my
Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do
Make and ordain this my last will and Testament, that is
To say principally and first, of all I Give and recommend my Soul
Into the hands of almighty God, that gave it and my body I
Recommend to that his Edict to be buried in a quiet Christian
Burial at the direction of my Executors, nothing doubting but at
the general resurrection, that I shall revive the same again
By the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate
Wherewith it hath pleased God, to Bless me in this world I Give
And devise and dispose of the same in the following manner—
Item I Give and bequeath to my son Mitchell Lee the
Plantation, and land whereon he now lives, as it is better and bounded
In the deed to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Catharine Edging one feather
Bed and furniture, one Pew and Pew one Gun two head of Sheep one
Chest one Saw and Piggs, some Cakes wares, to her and her heirs forever—
I Give to my daughter Catharine Edging, two Cowards one earling one
Hare all, two Iron pots, three Saws and nine Shovels, three plate plates
one Mason and a Pecker dish, to one Coo and all belonging to the
Coo, to one Adboard and all my earthen wares, one Grind Stone and
all my Hoes, and three head of Sheep, and my Spade, and one
Washing place, and all my Cakes wares, and all bell to one headboard
and two Heaters, and some Lunk bottles, and one Lining wheel
and all my sitting chairs, and two meal Sifters and all my Iron
and tools, to her and her heirs forever.

I Give to my daughter Catharine Edging one large Canoe, and
My Iron pot, animal and one quilt pot, and one Sill pot, and one
Coffee pot, to her forever.

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Philip Lee all the rest
of land except the tract to my son Mitchell Lee, that was before
mentioned, to him and his heirs forever. I leave the care of all
the land that I have given to my son Philip Lee to my daughter
Catharine Edging ten years. I do ordain and appoint my son
Philip Lee and Wm. Edging Executors, to this my last will and Testament.

 being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory
 thanks be given to God, calling unto mind the mortality of body knowing
 it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and declare
 this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first
 I give and recommend my soul into hand to almighty
 God that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be
 buried in decent christian burial at the discretion of my executors
 nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall revive
 the same again by the mighty Power of God, and as touching
 such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
 In this life I Give devise and dispose of the same
 In the following manner and form

First I Give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary
 all my ready money and one negro man named Coffey
 With all and singular the rest of my property of every sort
 during of his natural life, and then to be disposed of in the following
 manner, and first of all I Give and bequeath to my well
 beloved children, to wit. Mary Thomas, Christian, Richard
 & my son, John, Ruth any, six hundred and forty acres, of
 land lying on Long Road river, to be equally divided
 among them, also I Give and bequeath to my daughter
 Mary one Negro woman named Cath and two boys named
 Jack and Andrew, also I Give and bequeath to my
 Grand son Benjamin Daniel one negro Girl
 named Charry, also I Give and bequeath to my son Thomas
 one negro boy named Sam. also I Give to my daughter
 Christian one negro Girl named Cath. also I Give to my
 son Rich and Son, one Negro woman named Rachel
 also I Give to my son John one negro Girl named Mitty
 also I Give to my daughter Ruth and one negro woman named Cuddy

Also I Give to my Grand son Thomas one negro Girl
 named Miff, also I Give to my Grand son Thomas one
 one negro boy named Baron, also I Give to my son
 Thomas & Richard Son John one negro man named Sep.
 also I Give to my daughter Ruth any other piece of land wher
 she now lives beginning at Jacob May all line to the Great
 Tree running then East eleven degrees South to the sea side
 also I Give to my son John what piece of land wher
 he now lives from the Great Cherry tree to the Great line
 at the Old School house, running then East eleven degrees South
 to the sea side also I Give to my Grand son Thomas one
 Richard Son the piece of land wher he now lives from the
 Great oak at the School house to the Vain pole oak running
 then East eleven degrees South to the sea side also I Give to my
 Grand son Thomas one piece of land from the Vain pole
 Oak to son a dream then East eleven degrees South to the sea side
 also I Give to my son Richard Son a piece of land from
 the sea side to my North line then East to the sea side
 also I Give to my son Thomas that piece of land wher he now
 lives East aiming one hundred and fifty acres, also I Give to my
 son Thomas Richard Son John all my land on Cape Hatteras to be
 equally divided among them also I Give to my three sons Thomas
 Richard Son John all my water passages, also I Give to my
 daughter Ruth any one man Peter flower, also I Give to my
 Grand son Thomas one man Peter Spry, and three
 head of Cattle and one Gun also I Give to my children Sarah
 Mary Thomas, Christian, Richard Son John, Ruth any all my
 Stock of every kind, to be divided equally among them, also I
 Give to my son Thomas, Richard Son John and Ruth any a
 feather bed a pair also I Give to my three sons Thomas Richard
 Son John all and singular my property to be equally divided
 among them also I bequeath to make my three sons Thomas Richard
 Son John the sole executors of this my last will & testament and
 I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, annul, and of every other former
 testaments, wills, bequests, bequeaths, ratifications and confirmations, this & no other to be
 drawn, made, or bequeathed, ratified, or confirmed, which I have hereunto set
 my hand & seal this 15th day of Oct. 1803. Thomas Parry
