Item It is my desire that the balance of Estate be sold at the discretion of my Executor except my double faced gold watch which I give unto the above Robert F. Bishop forever and lastly I constitute and appoint my Cousin Moses Bonny Executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking all others as witnesses signed and sealed this 3^d day of September 1822 and for my said Executor not to be compelled to give bond and security for the performance of the same.

The last will and Testament of Samuel Salysar deceased Exhibited and proved at Feb. Term 1822

State of South Carolina In the Name of God Amen
County of Amick
I Samuel Salysar Senr. of the State and County aforesaid being in a low State of Health but of sound mind and memory thank be to God for the same. Calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son John B. Salysar the land and plantation whereon I now live with all the appurtenances therunto belonging bounded on the South on the Land of James Whitehall and on the North on the land of Samuel Salysar Junr. to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever. but in case my said Son should die without such heir or heirs then I give the said land and plantation to my daughter Susanna Salysar and her heirs forever. also I give and bequeath unto my son John B. Salysar the piece of land I bought of Lewis Williams containing seventy one and a half acres of land to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten of his body forever but in case my said Son should die without such heir or heirs then I give the said land unto my Daughter Susanna Salysar and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son Francis Salysar the land and plantation I bought of James Taylor to him and his heirs forever.

Also I give unto my son Francis Salysar fifty acres of swamp land out of the deed and land I bought of Samuel Jarvis lying back of the land formerly belonging to Joseph Gray deceased to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Salysar one piece of swamp land I bought of Jarvis Allen containing seventy one and a half acres to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John B. Salysar the other fifty acres of Swamp Land out of the deed of Samuel Jarvis to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever but in case my said Son should die without such heir or heirs then I give said swamp land unto my daughter Susanna Salysar and her heirs forever.

6 Item. I give and bequeath unto my three Sons Samuel Salysar John B. Salysar and Francis Salysar all my privilege of Swamp land lying back of James Spradley and Richard Allen reference being had to the Will of Thomas Taylor deceased and the deed of Samuel Taylor the privilege will fully appear to them and their heirs forever.

7 Item. I give and bequeath unto daughter Julia Salysar all my land lying on the East side of the main Road forming the land of Samuel Lindsay and also the piece of land I bought at the Widow of Nathan Salysar deceased to her and her heirs forever. Also one piece of swamp land lying back of the land where Nathan Salysar deceased formerly lived containing one hundred and eighty acres to her and her heirs forever.

8 Item. I give and bequeath unto my three Sons Samuel Salysar John B. Salysar and Francis Salysar an Island called Copey Island to them and their heirs forever. Also I give unto my three Sons Samuel Salysar John B. Salysar and Francis Salysar all my lands on Piney Island that I bought of Thomas Simmons and William Woodhouse to them and their heirs forever.

9 Item. I give and bequeath unto my three Sons Samuel Salysar John B. Salysar and Francis Salysar and my two Daughters Julia Salysar and Susanna Salysar one hundred acres of swamp Land out of the my patent that lyeth back of John I. Thompsons to them and their heirs forever.

10 Item. - my will and desire is that after my decease my Executor hereafter named shall at Six and Twelve months Credit all my Lands on the Banks lying at the Whales Head and where Mr. William Lewis lives together with all my Stock of all kinds on the Banks. Also the balance of my Swamp Land not given away lying back of John I. Thompsons and the Copey swamp I bought of Richard Taylor & Mary Taylor

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Wife Julia Salazar one negro man called Jubiter one Negro woman named Molly to her and her heirs forever. Also the use of a Negro Girl Bridget during her natural life. And after her death said Negro Girl Bridget and her increase if any to be equally divided amongst my Children to Wm Samuel Salazar John B Salazar Francis Salazar Julia Salazar and Susanna Salazar to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my three Grand sons Samuel Salazar and Edmund Salazar one Negro Man named Jack to be under the direction and Management of their Father untill the youngest comes to the age of twenty one years to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son John B Salazar one Negro man named Mack together with my shop and all my blacksmith tools to him and his heirs forever and if he should die without lawful heir of his body said Negro, shop and Black Smith tools to be sold and the money equally divided amongst his mother and brothers and sisters Julia Salazar his mother Samuel Salazar John B Salazar and Francis Salazar his Brothers Julia Salazar and Susanna Salazar his sisters to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Francis Salazar one Negro boy named Wallis Also one Negro boy named Challey to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Julia Salazar one Negro boy named Ned Also one Negro boy named Behn to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna Salazar one negro fellow named Will Also one negro boy named Jubiter one negro boy named Elliott one Negro Girl named Molly but if John B Salazar should die without issue so that my said daughter Susanna Salazar keeps the Land agreeable to the Gift in this Will then and in that case I give the above named Negro boys Jubiter and Elliott to be Equally divided between my wife Julia Salazar my Grand daughter Sally Salazar son Francis Salazar daughters Julia Salazar and Susanna Salazar to them and their heirs forever.

Item My Will and desire is that my two old negroes Sam and Tempt remain on my plantation under the direction of my wife Julia Salazar for the purpose of helping to raise my youngest Children.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my Wife Julia Salazar two feather beds and furniture her choice to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Julia Salazar one feather bed and furniture her Mother's choice to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I Give and bequeath unto my Son John B Salazar one feather bed and furniture his Mother's choice to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Francis Salazar one feather bed and furniture his Mother's choice to him and his heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna Salazar one feather bed and furniture her Mother's choice to her and her heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Julia Salazar one mare named Dor, one double riding Chair and harness one mare her choice Two cows and calves two ewes and lambs two sows and pigs one Walnut chest one hair trunk to her heirs forever.

Item I give unto my daughters Polly Salazar Children named Dotsey Salazar Elly Salazar William Salazar Sally Salazar and Delany Salazar Twenty dollar each to be raised out of my estate to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I Give the use of one horse one yoke of steers and cart one horse cart two Fishing Canoes as many of my farming Tools as will support the plantation four spots my wife's chair one large dining table six chairs one stand unto my wife Julia Salazar during her Widowhood and after her Marriage or death the above articles to be sold and the Money arising from the sale of said property to be Equally divided between my wife Julia Salazar and my son John B Salazar Francis Salazar Julia Salazar my daughter and Susanna Salazar my daughter to them and their heirs forever.

Item My Will and desire is that after my decease my Executors sell my Vessel if I have any at my death at Publick Sale for six nine and twelve months credit the notes to draw lawful Interest from the date.

Item My Will and desire is that the beds given my children in this Will be kept by my wife Julia Salazar untill they come of age or marry and not be sold by their Guardian.

Item I give to my wife Julia Salazar and her Children as much of my stock Crop and provisions as will be sufficient to support them and

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family one year and the yearly provision to be set off Thomas Poyner Isaac
Baxter Samuel Salazar and Lepe Barnard Town will understand there
is no live to be given in this gift only such as killed for immediate use
them I give unto my wife Julia Salazar my Loom stays great also all the
cotton wool and flax on hand also all my wheels to her and her
hus for the purpose of clothing her family.

And lastly I nominate and appoint my son Samuel Salazar
and my friends Isaac Baxter and Thomas Poyner Executors to
this my last Will and Testament revoking all other will
or Wills by me made ratifying and confirming this to be my
last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have set my
hand and seal this 1st day of December 1821

The last Will and Testament of William Brasley deceased Exhibited and proved at Feby, Term, 1822

In the Name of God Amen. I William Brasley of the State of North Carolina
and County of Currituck being sick and weak but perfect in mind and memory
thanks be unto God for it calling unto mind the mortality of man have a mind to settle
my worldly business in manner and form as follows do make this my last will and
testament first I give my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried in a
Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors and worldly goods in manner
and form as follows. Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Brasley
one mare by name Ginna one feather bed and furniture choice one cow and calf
choice one sow and pigs choice I also lend my negro woman named Dinah

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unto my wife during her life and after her death to be equally divided between
William Brasley Julia Jane Polly Whitehurst Nancy Brasley and Sally Brasley
Item I give unto my daughter Betsy White five dollars cash to be paid at the
settling of my estate. Item I give unto my daughter Sally Ansel five dollars cash
to be paid at the settling of my estate. I leave the north side of my land and
plantation whereon I now live to be rented out ten years from this date by my Executors
and the monies arising therefrom to be equally divided between William Brasley
Julia Jane Michael Brasley Polly Whitehurst Nancy Brasley and after
the term of ten years I give it to my grand son Tully Brasley son of John
Brasley in case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his body
my will is that Henry Brasley his Brother should have it beginning at a cedar
stake in edge of a branch a south easterly course from my house running
westerly course through the field to a apple tree from thence to a cedar stake near
the old house to post nursery from thence easterly continuing a westerly
course to pine in the edge of the woods thence by a line of marked trees to the main
road then the road being the line a Northwesterly course to John Jones's line
thence a easterly course down the said line to the branch from thence a
Southwesterly course the branch being the line to the first station.
Item. I give unto my son John Brasley five dollars to be paid out of
my movable property to be paid by my Executors at the settling of my
estate also I leave him the little place whereon he now lives to stay
at the term of ten years if he chooses and if not to be rented out with the
rest of the land. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Brasley the
south side of my land and plantation I now live on beginning the same cedar
stake running the same westerly course and bounded by the same trees
to the road thence the road being the line to James Ansel's or Charles Lovett's
line and thence a easterly course down James Ansel's line to the branch
from thence a Northwesterly course the branch being the line to the first station
I give and bequeath unto my son William Brasley the land I bought of Taylor Brasley as it stands
bounded to him and his lawful heirs lawfully begotten by his body but in
case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his body my will
is that my son Michael Brasley should have the said Also Item. I give
and bequeath unto my son Michael Brasley one negro girl named Ann
but in case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his
body my will is that my son William Brasley Sally Ansel Julia Jane
