I Jailes Gibbs of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina Being sick of body best of Good and Perfect memory Thanks be to the Almighty God and to Remembrance the merciful state of this Transitory life and that all flesh must yield unto death when it shall Please God to call Do make constitute Ordain and Declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form following Revoking heretofore by these Presents all and Every Testament and Testaments will and wills herefore by me made and done in either by Word or Writing and this is to be taken only for my last Will and Testament and none other and now for settling my temporal Estate and such good and chattels and debts as it hath pleased God far above my Dicrets to lay upon me I do order and give and dispose of the same in manner and form following That is to say first I Will all the debt and dues I owe right or in continuance to any manning Person or Persons what ever shall be will and truly contained and paid or ordained to be paid within convenient time after my death by my Executor here after named

Item I Lend to my beloved wife Sarah Gibbs all my estate all within doors and without doors during of her natural life or widowhood Then after her death for my son Elizha Gibbs to have my Land and Bert feather bed and furniture & one horn Calf & one Cow & Calf and Plantation Tools all the remainder Part of my Property to my Daughter Sarah Gibbs

2 I leave Jonathan Taylor to be my Executor
