 Testaments Will and Wills heretofore by me made and Decla-
 ring Either by Word or Writing and this is to be Taken only
 for my last Will and Testament and none other and none
 for settling my Temporal Estate and such Good and Chattels
 and Debts as it hath Pleas'd God for about my Decease to bestow
 upon me. I do order and Give and Dispose of the Same in Manner
 And form following that is to say first I Will all the Debt
 And Dues I Owe Right or in Continuance to any Manner Person
 or Persons What Ever Shall be Will and Truly Contented and
 Paid or ordained to the said Within convenient time after my Death
 by my Executor hereafter Named

Item I Give to my Beloved Wife Sarah Gibbs all my Estate all within
 Doors and Without Doors in during of her Natural Life or
 Widowhood Then after her Death for my Son Elisha Gibbs to have
 My Land and Best feather Bed and furniture Now here
 Call & one Cow & Calf and Plantation Tools all the Remain-
 Part of my Property to my Daughter Sarah Gibbs
 I Leave Jonathan Taylor to be my Executor
