I bind to my daughter Hester Vandover one pied piper, during her life, and after her death I give said Hester and all her increase to the heirs of my daughter Hester. Item. I bind to my daughter Sarah Jarvis one red heifer during her life, and after her death I give said heifer and all her increase to my said daughter Sarah's children, also I give unto my daughter Sarah Jarvis one stock of beef that is at her house already. Item. I bind unto my daughter Hester Vandover one stock of beef, and after her death I give the same and their increase to the heirs of my said daughter Hester. Item. I bind unto my beloved wife the use of all my negroes, during her life, also the use of a piece of land beginning at the main road opposite a large black Mulberry tree by the grave yard, to my daughter Hester, line all the land and buildings to the south of said course next to James Whitburn's, to go about a west course from the main road. Item. I give unto my son Anthony five mare coll. Item. I give unto my grand daughter Polly S. Cawnder thirty six dollars to be raised out of my estate. My request is that my executrix and executor thereafter named, sell such part of my estate (not already given away) as may be necessary to pay my just debts and funeral charges and no more. Also I give unto my beloved wife, my son Anthony and my two daughters Hester Vandover and Sarah Jarvis all the remainder of my estate not already given away to be equally divided between them, each party to choose one person to appraise and divide the same. Lastly, I nominate and appoint my beloved wife and my son Anthony executrix and executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof, I have hitherto set my hand and seal this 6th day of May 1815.

I give unto Matthias Toler my grand son twenty dollars to be laid out in schooling of said child. Item. I give unto Matthias Toler my grand son one cow and calf. Item. My will and desire is that all my property that I have not already given away be sold by my executrix, and after my just debts are paid all the remainder part of the money to be equally divided amongst all my children, to wit, James Toler, Sally, Chaplin and Polly Ethridge, and last of all I make and appoint my friend Simon Sawyer my executrix to this my last will and Testament. I Simon & Matthias citizen of Craven county and State of North Carolina, do make and ordain this instrument of writing to be my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. Viz. I bind my daughter Abi Dorey, one negro girl by the name of Love, during her natural life, and after her death I give and bequeath said negro Love to be equally divided amongst all my children. All Children. I give and bequeath to my daughter Abi Dorey one red and white cow and her yearling, also one yew and larch, one hand mill and chest that she now has. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Franklin Matthias one bed and furniture and one negro girl, by the name of Amy, and also one linen wheel to her and her heirs forever. Item. I bind to my beloved wife Elizabeth Matthias all the remainder of my property real, personal and chattel, after paying my just debts, during her widowhood. Item. I bind to my daughter Franklin Matthias after the death of her mother, during the time she shall have a single life the use of a part of my plantation as followeth Viz. beginning a ditch near the gate, then running down the ditch

to the leading ditch, then along that to the first small ditch that runs through the leading field to the Plumby nursery, then by the yard to a little ditch back of the yewpon patch, then along that ditch to the ditch in the branch ther to the first station, and a privilege of wood and coal lumber, and part of the yewpon and privilege of the house. I 1881. I give all my lands and plantation after the death of my wife Elizabeth Matthias to my son William & Matthias to him and his heirs forever. Item. After the death of my wife Elizabeth Matthias, I give to my son William & Matthias one hundred mill, one gun, and one large looking glass and bed and furniture. Item. I give to my daughter Abi Dacey one bed and furniture, to her and her heirs. Item. I give to my daughter Franky Matthias our bed and furniture. Item. I give to my son William Matthias two negro girls one by the name of Cire, and one by the name of Timine and also one negro man Call, and negro woman Name, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Franky Matthias three negroes Mary, Sarah and Lucy to her and her heirs forever and also one horse creature if any alive at the death of their mother. I give and bequeath to my son William and daughter Franky all my hogs, sheep and cattle after the death of their mother to be equally divided amongst them. I also give my son William & Matthias one horse cart and harness. My will and desire is that all the remainder of my property that I have not given away be equally divided between my daughter Abi Dacey and son William Matthias and Franky Matthias. I also nominate, constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth Matthias and son William & Matthias my lawful executors to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the twentieth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifteen.

The last Will and Testament of George Rowland deceased Exhibited and proved at August tenth 1815 —

In the name of God Almen: I George Rowland of the county of Currituck and state of North Carolina, being weak and sick in body, but of a sound and disposing mind and memory, and calling to mind the mortality of the body, do make and constitute this my last will and Testament in manner following. To wit. First I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my body to the dust to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors herein after mentioned, and to what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow me with I leave in manner following. Viz. First I leave twelve acres of my land to be sold adjoining the road that leads to Jeremiah Perkins' to continue in equal width from the Bell line to the arch at the corner of John Bills fence, also one horse cart, for six months credit. Item. I give and bequeath to my wife Polly Rowland all my property with in doors and without doors, and the plantation, during her widowhood. Item. I give and bequeath all the remainder of my lands to be equally divided between Edmund Rowland and Elmano Rowland and Andrew Rowland to them and their heirs forever. I make and constitute and appoint my wife Polly Rowland wife and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament, revoking all others wills or wills heretofore made by me. In witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this 27th day of March one thousand eight hundred and twelve.

I give to my son William Green the plantation on which I now live to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give to my sister Polly Godby five barrels of corn, one cow and calf, to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give to my daughter Olive Green and my son Joel Green all the remainder of my property both real and personal to be equally divided between them two, and in case either of them should die without lawful issue the property to go to the survivor. I make and appoint my worthy friend James Nelson Executor to this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I set my hand and seal this first day of August one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and 39th or 40th of American Independence.
