Carrickhouny. At an Inferior Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions
held, at the Court house, for the said County on the first
Tuesday in October Anno Domini 1762
Present his Majesty's Justices

There two Wills, to wit, the last Will & Testament of Solomon Armstrong
and that of Robert North were then & there exhibited in open Court
in due form of law, the Executors qualified, they were
ordered to be recorded, and here they filed in these words
Accordingly To wit

The last Will & Testament of Solomon Armstrong stands thus viz.

In the name of God Amen, I Solomon Armstrong of Carrickhouny in the
Province of South Carolina being sick and weak of Body but of sound and
perfect memory Thanks be to God for the same. Do make and ordain
this my last Will & Testament in the manner and form followeth. Nam I give
my love to the Almighty God that was pleased to give it to me and my body
to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors and
my worldly good as followeth
I give and bequeath to my son John part of my Plantation that formerly be-
longed to him & I give to him and his Heirs for ever Lake wife a thirty
acres I have made made from John's former piece of land keeping
to the choice to the Norway Code so Colled and what was bought over
the same to Benjamin Northern and they Heirs for ever
I give and bequeath to my Two Brothers Jesse and James thirty Acres
of land that formerly belonged to William Smith's own acres that I bought
of John Smith's to be equally divided between them and to their Heirs
for ever

I give to my Daughter Sally one Breed & Three Cows and Calves
I give to my Sister Peggy one and you and your and one Cow and Calf
my will and desire is that after my lawfull Debts is paid that remainder
of my estate I equally divided betwixt my well beloved wife and my Two
Children (John & ever) and make and ordain Constable and agent my
well beloved wife Elizabeth Armstrong Executors and Benj Northern Executor
with my wife of this my last will and Testament given under my hand
and seal this 26th Day of May anno 1762
