I give my Heirath to my daughter Mary Gregory one acre to her heirs forever.

I give my Heirath to my son Samuel Whiturst my dwelling plantation known as
with all the land thence belonging. All Land Plants Trees over and one acre to
him and his heirs forever.

I give my Heirath to my daughter Rachel Whiturst one tenth her furniture to her
and her heirs forever.

I give my Heirath to my daughter Lydia Whiturst one acre to her and her heirs forever.

I give my Heirath to my daughter Mary Whiturst one tenth her furniture to her and her heirs
forever the remainder of my Estate within the Court house after all my just debts recovered
are paid to my wife Elizabeth Whiturst during her natural life better her cause to be
equally divided among these persons to wit my two daughters Rachel & Lydia Whiturst
and my grand daughter Lydia Gregory to them three acres forever.

In witness that I do hereby constitute Richard Stanley Esq. & Richard Whiturst
my wife Executors to this my last Will & Testament as also to act & do agreeable as the law
shall be given under my hand and seal this 25th day of October in the year of
our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty.

weak of body but of sound memory did by his last Will & Testament made this 25th day of November
One Thousand Seven hundred and Eighty eight he made provision for his wife Elizabeth Whiturst in manner
following (that is to say) First. Her to be left a dwelling house garden along roads during her
life or Bedchamber either my self or my son John Thompson. I give my furniture to her
and her heirs forever all my furniture. I give my Heirath to my daughter Sarah Lachon bed
furniture which shall be left to my said daughter. I give my Heirath after the death of marriage
of my wife Sarah Thompson all my lands & chattels or whatsoever may be equally divided between
my son William Thompson my son John Thompson my son Richard Thompson & my daughter
Sarah Thompson. Under his wife Sarah Thompson her son Richard Thompson while sole
executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof the test William Thompson
have set my hand & affixed my seal the day & date first above written.

being at this week sick but of a dying man & memory very poor sense thanks to god to the
saints and borders this to be my last Will and Testament from law or usage he
gives my Heirath unto my wife Elizabeth my wife all the rest of
my Estate both within doors without during her natural life or widowhood my will is
disease is that my wife have the liberty of taking any part of my movable Estate to pay my
debts and charges - And if my wife should many my will desire is that she should have
the third part of my Land & Plantation, and the third part of all my movable Estate.
Item. I give my Heirath unto my son Richard George at my wife's death or marriage the Land &
Plantation I now live on to him and his heirs forever - And if my son Richard
George die without an my desire is that my son Richard George should take the
Land and Plantation my will desire is at my wife's death or marriage that we three of
my Estate should be sold & the money equally divided between my children & wife
George. My will desire is that the Court should have nothing to do with my Estate
earlier than to prove my will. And lastly I appoint my wife Elizabeth George
to be my sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament & dissolving all
other Wills and Testaments by me made. Testifying & confirming this to be my last
Will and Testament and to the best of my knowledge I have sealed it my hand this 25th
day of December 1789.

and his heirs forever.

Item. I give my Heirath to my wife Sarah Lindsey the one half of all my Estate within doors &c &c
without doors during her life or widowhood.

sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament signed, sealed and delivered
