the Land of Stephen Miskit and Allen Possessing the South Part

and to hold unto them my Two Sons Ambrose and Allen Daugh
for their Own Proper use Benefit and behoof -

I Likewise I Give and bequeath unto my Son Ambrose Daugh
One Mare Coll'd Polly One Feather Bed and furniture and
One Sea Bed and One Chest to have and to hold for his Own use
Benefit and behoof

I Likewise Except My Wife Mary Daugh's Life on the
Possessions of my son Allen Daugh's Part of the Land -

I Give and bequeath unto my Well beloved Wife Mary Daugh
One feather Bed and furniture and ~~One Chest~~
One Chest One Trunk One Case of Wattle One Linnen Wheel
Wooling Wheel and six Selling Chairs and Twenty Eight Dollars
and a half of Queens China and forty hand Dollars to have &
to hold for her Own Proper use Benefit and behoof

I Give and bequeath unto my Beloved Daughter Mary
Daugh one feather Bed and furniture One Linnen Wheel
One Trunk One Chest One set of India Chancas Containing
forty One Pieces One Dining Table to have and to hold for
her Own use Benefit and behoof

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Adam Daugh One Hair
Coll'd Dacey One Sea Bed my hunting Gun my wearing
Watch and fifteen Dollars in Cash and One Chest to have &
hold for his Own use Benefit and behoof

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Ambrose Daugh one
feather Bed and furniture One hand Mill One Breakfast Table
and six Selling Chairs to have and hold for his Own use
Benefit and behoof

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Cynthia Daugh
One feather Bed and furniture one Dining Table One Sea
Chest to have and hold for her Own use Benefit and behoof

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Jesse Daugh one feather
Bed and furniture one Buffet one Iron pot One Dutch Oven
Three Peter Dishes One Reason and five plates to have and
to hold for his Own use Benefit and behoof

Item my Will and Desire is so that My Schooner Called the Regulator
shall be converted to the use and support of my family so long
as she shall Answer the Purpose in so drawing and when she
shall fail Giving support unto my family my Will is so
that she shall be sold at Publick Auction and that my
Son Ambrose shall Take Charge of said Schooner so long
as his Occumy shall be approved of by the Executors

Item my Will is so that all the Remainsing part of my Property
that is not Mentioned in the Legacies I Give unto my
Will beloved Wife Mary Daugh During her Natural Life
Or Widowhood and if this my said Wife should Decease
My Will is so that this Remainsing part of my Property
shall be Equally Divided Between my five Children
Mary Adam Hambleton Cynthia and Jesse Daugh
And if my said Wife shall Marry my Will is so that
she shall have her Equal part in the Division of
The Remainsing Part of said Property and I Likewise
Constitute Make and Ordain my said Wife Mary
Daugh and Barnabee Sheridge My Sole Executor to this
My Last Will and Testament and I Likewise Disan-

all Mankind once to die and after Death to appear in
Judgment I there for Recommend my sole to Almighty God
that it use and my Body to be Buried in such Christian
like Manner as shall be to the Refreshment of my Estate
Here After Mentioned and to be done as it shall Please
The Lord to help me with Sun Wesley Prebster in Permisham
I Bury in the following Manner —
Item I Give and Bequeath to my Two Sons Richard and

Henry Sanderson all one Tract of Land where on I know

Leave to be Equally Divided the Island Pat to Richard and
The Island Pat to Henry and there are for ever all so Tract
= red Bequeath of Wankie Land adjoining the Great Hammock and
to be Divided along West side as to split the Hammock Equely
Between my Two Sons all so Two small Pieces of Wankie Land
to the North Equely to them and there are for ever all so all my
Small Islands of Marsh

Item I Leave the Care of my Negro Gards to my wife Sarah
Sanderson in Duration of her Life or wisdom and then to
my son Richard Sanderson and his heirs for ever

Item I Leave the Right of all the Negroes known in the Hands of
the Woodhams that was coming to the Bay my first wife
Sarah to my Son Richard and there are for ever

Item I Give to my son Henry Sanderson One Negro Boy call
Morus and his heirs for ever and in case either of my Two
Sons shall Dies With out Lawfull issue of their Body
then estate to go to the Surviving one

Item I Leave all the Remain of my Land to be sold that is
Not Given away

Item And in Case my Daughter Mary Doty Don't Git the Negroes from
the Woodhams for her to have One hundred & seven Dollars
to be Paid out of my Estate and then the Residue of my
Estate that aint Given a way to be Equely Divided
And Share alike and I Do Here By Demand and Revoke all
and Ever other Will or Wills Herebefore Made By me and
Relieve this and no other to be my will and Testament —
Made in Writing and I Do Here By Demand and appoint
Benjin Taylor Esq. the whole and sole Exor of this
My Last Will and Testament in Witness Whereof I have
here unto set my Hand and Seal this 9th Day of
January 1801
