

In the name of God, (AMEN). I Thomas Farrow of the county of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being sick and weak of body, but of sound disposing mind and memory, blessed be the almighty god for its calling to mind the sure certainty of this life and its being ordained once for all people to die, I do make and ordain this instrument of writing to contain my last will and Testament, disannulling and revoking all other wills and Testament heretofore made by me either by word or writing, and this only to be taken as my last will and Testament. First, that is to say, I recommend my soul to (Almighty) God that gave it, & my body to be decently in a christian like manner, buried in a place where it may please my executor hereafter named, and as to what worldly estate it shall please god to bestow on me far above my deserts, I give and dispose in manner and form as follows. First. I gave and bequeath unto my son Miles Farrow and my son Ignatious Farrow my two plantations on Mathamsweet to be equally divided between them two, and my son Miles Farrow to have the plantation where Ambrose Long now lives, and my son Ignatious Farrow to have the plantation where John Neal lives, it is my will and desire that my two sons before mentioned should pay unto my two youngest daughters Elizabeth Farrow and Asenath Farrow fifty dollars per year for sixteen years, each son to pay twenty five dollars yearly. I also gave unto my son Miles Farrow fifty acres of land joining Silas Farrow's eastern line. I also gave unto my little daughter Asenath Farrow fifty acres of land joining Miles Farrow's eastern line, and Sarah Neal westward line to her and her heirs forever. I gave unto my little grand son Joseph Farrow thirty acres of land, where Jacob Williams formerly lived joining James Neal's eastern line, to him and his heirs forever. I gave unto my son Asa Farrow forty six acres and two thirds of land joining John Farrow's southern line, being part of the land my father formerly lived on, to him and his heirs forever. I gave unto my daughter Elizabeth Farrow seventy five acres of land where Thomas Bradley now lives, to her and her heirs forever. I gave unto my daughter Scamay Farrow seventy five acres of land joining the land that I gave to my daughter Elizabeth Farrow, where Thomas Bradley now lives, running to the north of Elizabeth Farrow's land, to her and her heirs forever. Also, I gave unto my daughter Elizabeth Farrow my horse & land whereon I now live, containing ninety eight acres to her and her heirs forever, & the house to be moved on Miles Farrow's land, that joins Silas Farrow's land. I gave all the rest of my land to be equally divided between my two sons Miles Farrow and Asa Farrow to them and their heirs forever. I also gave unto my son Miles Farrow

one negro man by the name of Joseph to him and his heirs forever. I also gave unto my son Asa Farrow one negro woman by the name of Rachel to him and his heirs forever. I also gave unto my daughter Elizabeth Farrow one negro girl by the name of Malagie to her and her heirs forever. I also gave unto my little daughter Asenath Farrow one negro man by the name of Quay; also one negro woman by the name of Varney, to her and her heirs forever. I also gave unto my little grand son Joseph Farrow one negro boy by the name of Jacob to him and his heirs forever. I also gave unto my two youngest daughters Elizabeth Farrow and Asenath Farrow one negro girl by the name of Dorcas to them and their heirs forever. It is also my will & desire that my schooner boat should be sold, and all my just debts to be paid out of the money arising from the sale of said boat. After all my just debts and funeral charges is paid, then I gave all the rest of my property then remaining to be equally divided among all my children as before mentioned. I do also constitute make and appoint my son Miles Farrow and my friend John Clark executors to this my last will and Testament, to settle this my estate according to law, as witness my hand and seal this 31st day of January, in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and fifteen.

In the name of God, (AMEN). I Anthony Simmon of the county of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being sick of body, but of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, in manner and form as follows. In the first place, I lend to my daughter Hester Vandover one piece of land bounded as follows, beginning at mine and Cornelius Moore's corner on the road and running down the road two hundred yards, then a parallel course with Mercer's line until it comes to my son's line hereafter mentioned, to her my said daughter Hester during her life, and after her death, I give the said land to the children of my said daughter Hester. I also give to my daughter Hester thirty six dollars, to be paid her out of my estate. Then I lend to my daughter Sarah Jarvis one piece of land beginning at a small red oak well known by my family, then running about a south east course or about down the branch between the road and Ackland's Island to James Whitcomb's line, then up his and Samuel Forber's line runs northwardly, and so up to the land I have given my grand daughter Polly St. Cavenier and to the road and as the road runs to the beginning red oak, all that part northwardly and eastwardly of the first mentioned line, to her my daughter Sarah Jarvis I lend the said piece of land during her life, and after her death, I give said land to the heirs of my said daughter Sarah Jarvis. Then I give all the remainder of my lands to my son Anthony Simmon.
