

In the last Will & Testament of Thomas Forebee stands thus Recorded vizt.

In the Month of God Jan: in the Year of Our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and Sixty six of age past. Item in Consideration as farr as proper to make my will w^t h^t A. T. Forebee. In witness I give my soul into the Hands of god Almighty in all humble hope of his future assistance as to the disposal of all thing infinitely good my Body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors and Executrix hereafter mentioned and as to the temporal Estate which by word of his goodness hath been pleased to bless me with I do order give and dispose thereof as followeth Item I give Bequeath unto my Daughter Junice that Tract or Part of Land for only held by Thomas Swain containing ninty three Acres more or less and thereto a small Piece lying on the south side of the said ninety three Acres containing ten Acres more or less and bounded by the Division Line between myself & my Brother James to her & her offspⁿ Body for ever and make the same without Ifue to be equally divided amongst my Daughters Junice and Frankly to them and the Heirs of their Bodies for ever Item I give to bequeath to my Daughter Junice the Plantation I now live on containing one hundred acres more or less and bounded as followeth Beginning at the Foot of the Mill Dam and running towardes the South West to the South line of a Tract of Land whitch I sold my Brother James whence going that line to the beginning line of my new land and so bounded by Brachet & Brachet's Patent line North & Degree East to a Coppice the same bounded by Moyock Creek to the first Station to her & the Heirs of her Body for ever Item I give and Bequeath to my Daughter Frankly the residue of my Land beginning at the Foot of the Mill Dam & so running downe the Brook to the first turning Branch there in the S Branch till it striketh the maine road leading to Newland hence running up the maine Road to the Hill to her & the Heirs of her Body for ever and in case all of my said Daughters should die without Issue then I give all my Land to my Son in Law Forebee and the Heirs of his Body for ever Item I give to bequeath to my Son in Law Forebee with the use of my Negro Wm Pege during his life and after his Death or Marriage which I shall foyl my self then he shall represent Wm Pege with his future Issue I give to bequeath to be equally divided amongst my three Daughters before mentioned Item my Will & Desire is that my executors & Executrix sell so much of my Personal Estate as shall be sufficient to discharge my just Debts and the remainder I give to bequeath to be equally divided amongst my Wife and three Children Item my Will & Desire is that if my executors & Executrix should agree to payable But whom I have hired to do the Brack Work of my New House to sell with them that they pay him out of my Estate ten Poundes of English Money Item I give to bequeath to my Daughter Junice one Gold Ring marked M. & J. in my Will & Desire in that if I leave my aforementioned Children or any other offsprⁿ should be suffered by their Mother to pursue a vicious or wicked course either of them selfe or of their Friends John Burges and William Wilson have the same

The last Will & Testament of Thomas Williams Slaves this Recorded Augt.

In the name of God amens. I Thomas Williams being sick and weak of body and of
perfect mind and sound memory thanks be to the all mighty god for it and having
that it is appynded unto all renounce to dy Do make and ordain this to be my last
will and testament in manner and forme following that is to say first I chare and
my sole to almighty god and my Body to be Buried at the Decrees of my Executors
here after mentioned I first stur my Hell and Desir is that all my just debts
duly paid and Discharged

I then I send the use of my Plantation and Land and Marsh that I brought off Chafford
to my son william williams During his Natural life and after his decease I give
and bequeath to my grandson Dorcasus williams the aforesaid Plantation -
Land and Marsh to him and his heirs for ever and if my grandson Dorcasus
williams should by accident leave all his estate or the use of his Body then I give
and bequeath the use of said Plantation Land and Marsh to my grand daughter
Virginia williams and her heirs of her Body for ever and in case she
should by happen to have then issue and bequeath the use of Virginia
and Land to the next heir of the Body of my son william williams
for ever likewise I send the use of one Negro wench called Dumbie and
her Notes to my son william williams paying his life and service
she wench and her infants to be equally Devided Between my two granddaughters
Virginia williams and Dorcasus williams and their heirs for ever likewise
and my son william williams the use of one land shall for then pay
her notes not be Devided from the Plantation

I then I give and bequeath to my daughter mary williams the first Child that my
decease wench bearing that is less to the age of two years to be delivered
to the age of mary williams without any Cost or Charge for having
the aforesaid Child
