It is my will and desire that my Plantation in Currituck in the State of North Carolina be sold at the direction of my trustees and executors hereafter named and the money arising from the said sales be given and bequeathed to my brother Jonathan's two Children, Anna Williamson and Jonathan Williamson to them and their heirs forever the trustee to be appointed hereafter to dispose of the Interest arising from the sale of the Plantation for the education and support of my brother Jonathan's two Children before named, and the Principle to be paid them on their respective days of marriage or their attaining lawful age that is to say my three sons the age of Eighteen Years and my Nephew Jonathan to the age of twenty one lastly I appoint my two brothers Jonathan Williamson and Gaius Williamson and my friend Doctor William Leigh trustees and executors for the purpose of executing this my last will hereby revoking all wills by me heretofore Made In Testimony and Testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th March 1802.

In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Heath of the State of North Carolina and County of Currituck, being sick and weak in body but of sound Mind and Memory do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament Calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to die, do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament In manner and form following Viz

First I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Julian Heath, one half of my Plantation Wheron I now live to include the part wheron my House and Orchard is, during her Natural life.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Wife Julian Heath One Negro Man Called Jim also One Negro Woman Pigg to her and her heirs forever. also One black horse & riding Chair to her and her heirs forever. Also three Cows and One first Choice also One feather bed and furniture first Choice to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Heath the one half of the tract of land Wheron I now live to be divided by a line from the main line straight to the North River Swamp the North Part part to my said Son Thomas to him and his heirs forever after the survey of this matter.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son John Heath the other half of my tract of land the South Part unto my Son John Heath, to his heirs and assigns forever, also one young errair Colt also Two Cows and Calves, also One feather bed and furniture, also one Gun to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Thomas Heath two Cows and One also One feather bed and furniture, also the first Colt, my Roan errair Horse to him, also One Gun, also One Cow, that runs off Dharma Simprens to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my daughter Julian Heath, one Negro Woman Called Edy, and Child to her and her heirs forever, one young Heifer to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give and Give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Heath, one Little Negro Girl Called Rose, to her and her heirs forever, also one feather Bed and furniture also one Cow and Colt and two young Heifers, one Caprine Black and the other Red. I Give back to her and her heirs forever.

I Give and bequeath unto my Wife Julian Heath One Bedch. also One Walnut Table to her and her heirs forever.

I am My Will and desire is that the balance of it due me in right of My Wife Julian, from a legacy left her by Samuel Burnard deceased. Now in the hands of the Executor of the said Samuel due be applied. By my Executors to the payment of my Just debts.

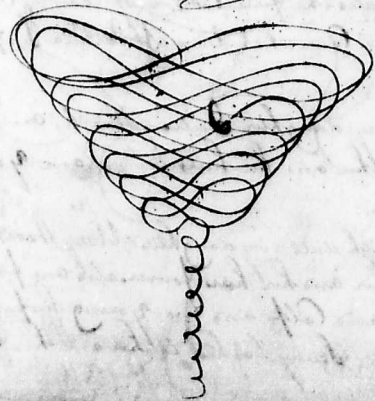

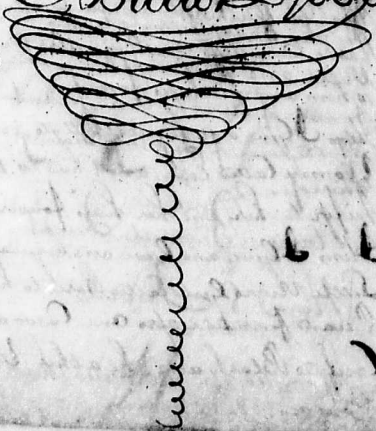

Supremis I Give unto my Sons John, and James, and Thomas Bunnells, all my land Laining William Wards lands and the same. And if the Child my wife is with Child with is a boy then four to be equally divided between them, and if a girl Child to be equally divided between four three names to them and their heirs forever.

I Give the Child my wife is with Child with if a girl Child, and her and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

I Give all my lands over the Creek, to be sold to pay my debts.

I am after my debts is paid I Give the remainder of my property to be equally divided between the Children living. When they are of Age, to take it them and their heirs forever.

I hereby make and Ordain my worthy friend Edw. Bunnell Executor of this my last Will and Testament. I Set my hand and Seal the day and year above Written.
