First of all I give unto my well beloved wife Sarah Midgett, my land house and all improvements thereon, all my moveable property in doors and out doors, all that I possess, during her single life, and then my land with all improvements thereon to be equally divided amongst my three boys, namely Anthony Midgett, William B. Midgett, Matthew C. Midgett, likewise all my moveable property in doors and out doors of every sort and kind, after the end of my wife single life to be equally divided amongst all my children, boys and girls. Likewise I make institute and ordain Sarah Midgett my wife and John Ballance sole executors of this my last will and testament, also I disannul revoke and disallow any other former will and testament, intaking and confirming this and this only to be my last will and testament, denying all other instruments of writings wills or whatsoever may be brought toward but this I acknowledge to contain the whole of will and devise Given under my hand and seal this the seventh day of May one thousand eight hundred and seven

I give unto my wife Sally Heath one feather bed & furniture to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my wife Sally Heath one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my sister Julia Heath, one mare called Poll more, to her & heirs forever. Item. I give unto my wife Sally Heath one colt to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my wife Sally Heath and my sister Julia Heath, all my cattle and hogs to be equally divided between them to them and their heirs forever. Item. my will and devise after my decease, all my just debts be paid out of the notes & judgments, that I leave, and the remainder after my debts are paid, I give unto my wife Sally Heath and my sister Julia Heath, to be equally divided between them. Item. I give unto my wife Sally Heath one looking glass the one on the east side of the room. Item. I give unto my sister Julia Heath one looking glass on the west side of the house. Item. I give unto my sister Julia Heath six silver tea spoons, also all the plates in the cupboard, that was my mothers. Item. I give unto my wife Sally Heath one small chest, also all the remainder of the cupboard furniture, that I have not already given away to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my brother John Heath one watch to him and his heirs forever, also one mans saddle to him & his heirs forever; also all my clothes that he can get on. I give unto my sister Julia Heath one table. I give unto my sister Julia Heath all my setting chairs that was my mothers. I give unto Joseph Beardsell, all the remainder of my dressing apparel. I give unto my wife Sally Heath, all the remainder of my setting chairs, to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my sister Julia Heath one chair whip. I give unto my wife six pewter plates, also one red table, also one buffet. I give unto my wife Sally Heath and my sister Julia Heath, all the remainder part of my property, that I have not already given away to be equally divided between them.

Item. Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Thomas Poynor
my whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament.

daughter Lucy Thornton five shillings to her and her heirs
forever. Item. I leave the use of all my estate both with
doors and without, of every nature and kind, to my well
beloved wife Elizabeth Ethridge, during her widowhood
and at the expiration of her widowhood either by death
or marriage, then all that remains to be sold at publick
auction, and the money to be equally divided between
my four children namely, Joel, Chloe, Franklin, Josiah
Ethridge, to them and their heirs forever, and Lastly
I nominate constitute and appoint my wife Elizabeth
Ethridge and my friend John Sorey my executors of this
my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
set my hand and seal this twenty six day of September
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight
hundred and thirteen.

of Currituck and state of North Carolina, being in a fair state of
bodily health but of sound mind and disposing memory, do
think it expedient to dispose of my worldly estate as follows.

Item. I lend to my wife Elizabeth Hill during the time of her
marriage or widowhood, the use and possession of a part of the lands
and plantation, wherein I now live, being bounded as follows,
beginning at a ditch on the westward part of the plantation adjoin-
ing the lands belonging to the heirs of John Bowen dec'd, thence
binding on said ditch nearly an east course through the plan-
tation, thence a straight line through the woodland to a water
hole, at the head of a branch, thence northwardly binding on
said said branch to the person, thence westwardly binding on
said person to the mouth of a branch, being the line the line
between the said land and the lands of Dancy Jones, thence up
said branch to a post, being a line post between said lands of
Dancy Jones & the heirs of John Bowen dec'd, thence southward-
ly to the first beginning, containing by estimation forty five
acres, be the same noble or less. Further give and
leave to her and her heirs forever one negro girl named
Rose, one horse and two cows and calves of her own
