In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Luffman of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being in sound mind and perfect memory, thank be to God for the same, do make and ordain this as my last will and testament annulling all other and former will by me made in word or writing, first my will and desire is that all my just debts be paid.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to Edward Gamett all the right and title which I have in or to the tract of Land whereon he now lives — Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Sarah Luffman all the remainder of my estate real and personal after my said debts be paid and I nominate and appoint my said wife my executrix to this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 5th day of July 1893.

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The Last Will and Testament of Julia Vanderson deceased
Exhibited and proved November Term 1895

State of North Carolina, in the name of God Amen, I Julia Vanderson of the County of Currituck and State of North Carolina, being in sound mind and memory, do make and constitute this to be my last Will and testament.

First of all I recommend my soul to God in the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my worldly Goods I give in the following manner. I give to my son John Vanderson one feather bed and furniture the first choice. I give to my daughter Polly one feather bed the 2nd choice. I give to my son Thomas one bed the 3rd choice and to my son John the 4th choice and to my son John the 5th choice with the furniture in proportion. I give my three Horses to be divided between my three oldest sons in all the proceeds to be sold to and divided between the same three boys my son Thomas to have one hundred dollars and the balance of sales of Horses and crop to be equally divided between the three boys. All the rest of my property in door and out to be sold and divided in the following manner. To my son John one hundred dollars and the balance of proceeds to be equally divided between my daughter Polly and my son John Vanderson. I nominate my friend Thomas White my sole and sole Executor in witness I have set my hand and seal this 5th day of July 1895.
