

The Last will and Testament of Thomas Mackhorney, deceased was exhibited in open Court at May term 1832 & proven by the oath of H. Ball a witness & recorded & recorded In the name of God Amen Thomas Mackhorney of the County of Currituck in the State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and that it is appointed for man to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following viz

Item I give and bequeath to my son Jasper Mackhorney what he has already received and no more to him & his heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsy Mackhorney one duck one feather bed and furniture one cow and calf to her heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Julian what she has already rec^d and no more to her and her heirs

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Peggy Jones what she has already rec^d and no more to her and her heirs

Item All the remainder of my Estate within doors & without I Give to my beloved wife Bridget Mackhorney during her single life and then to be divided between my two daughters, Sarah Mackhorney and Bridget Mackhorney and if my wife Bridget Mackhorney shall fit to marry at her marriage the property I Give to my wife Bridget to be divided in three equal parts one part to my wife one part to my daughter Sarah Mackhorney and the other part my daughter Bridget Mackhorney and their heirs

Lastly my Will and desire is that my true and trusty friend Cusck Ball is hereby appointed constituted & ordained whole & sole Executor to this my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and first my seal this 28th day of November 1832

The Last Will and Testament of Polly Shaw dead was Exhibited in open Court at Feby Term 1832 & proven by the oaths of Daniel Curdley for Edw.athan B. Curdley Justice of the Peace The Executors Qualify & ordered Receipt

In the name of God Amen I Polly Shaw of the County of Currituck State of North Carolina Being of sound and perfect memory helped he had do this day the 26th day of Feby in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty two make and publish this my last will and testament in the manner as follows

First I give and bequeath to my dear beloved husband Esmeck Shaw four negroes, namely one negro man by the name of Ben and one by the name of Jo and a negro girl by the name of Harriett a negro woman by the name of Phel my two grey horses and new Carriage a large bed & furniture and a ²water bedstead below stairs on his choice of the beds

a live stairs and I give him my husband and his years promise for him and his family to be paid by three dismounted gold pieces yearly I give and bequeath to my son James Sanderson one negro man by the name of Sam one negro woman by the name of Sarah and one negro woman by the name of Sudah one feather bed and furniture half dozen chairs & one secretary and book case

Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Sanderson one negro man by the name of Rudge one boy by the name of Martin and one negro woman by the name of Phane and two feather beds, & furniture one clock one sideboard and the furniture on it half dozen large silver ^{table} spoons and half dozen silver tea spoons and a silver cup

Thirdly I give and bequeath to Polly Sanderson daughter of Samuel Sanderson one feather bed and furniture one blue chest half dozen flowered ~~chairs~~ chairs

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my worthy friend Mary Taylor one large blue chest & twenty dollars to be paid out of residue of my estate

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my niece Margaret Nash fifty dollars in cash to be paid out the residue of my estate

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my nephewess Nash fifty dollars in cash to be paid out the residue of my estate

Eighthly I give to my old negro man Sam five dollars a year for one year or long as he lives and for it to be paid by my husband to him & Shaw James Sanderson on my son Thomas Sanderson

And lastly for the crop now commenced to be carried on by my husband & I A Shaw and for the negroes I have given away to remain on the farm with my husband until the first day of next January, to lend the crop &c and then for
