 of my upland on Roanoke Island Chirkey  
 Swamp including I give to be equally divided  
 between my three Daughters Elizabeth Austin  
 Dantes Fugh and Anny Daniel to them and  
 their Heirs for ever all my marsh on Roanoke  
 Islands and all my land property on Bodie  
 Island. I give for a privilege equally amongst  
 the whole of my six before mentioned Children  
 sons and Daughters to them and their heirs forever  
 like wise all my boat and Canoe I give equally  
 amongst my my three sons black Smith too &  
 Shop to James Thomas and a boy Daniel  
 to them and their heirs forever likewise and  
 and singular the remaining of my property I give  
 equally amongst the whole of my Children before  
 mentioned Elizabeth Austin Dantes Fugh James  
 Thomas Anny & Anny Daniel to them and  
 their Heirs forever  
 I give to Anny Daniel my large Blue flower  
 Chest. I give to Anny Daniel on Bed Bedstead  
 and furniture that is to say 1 Bolster 2 pillows  
 2 shirts 3 Blankets and one Kegg. - to Anny  
 Daniel all the Calico & all the mullin on hand  
 etc to Anny Daniel on wa Herring Horse  
 running on Bodie Island - like wise I give to  
 my daughter Elizabeth Austin one feather Bed and  
 furniture - to my daughter Dorcas Fugh one  
 Cow Head on bodie Island the before mentioned  
 articles to them and their heirs for ever  
 Likewise and singular the remaining part of my  
 property not before given I give to my six

before mentioned sons and daughter likewise I nominate  
 and appoint my three sons my heirs & heirs  
 to this my last will and Testament in witness  
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal  
 this the thirtieth day of October in the Year of our  
 Lord eighteen hundred and twenty

This last will & Testament of Joseph Daniel Sr.

This last will and Testament of Thomas  
 Anderson Esq. Dec. was exhibited in open  
 Court at August Term 1821  
 In the name of God Amen I Thomas Anderson of  
 Currituck County and State of North Carolina  
 Being weak in Body But of sound and disposing  
 mind and memory Bless God for the same  
 and calling to mind that it is appointed for  
 man once to die and after death the judgment  
 and knowing that in a short time I shall  
 be called to give an account of my Stew-  
 -ardship hear below which I trust I shall do  
 with Joy not with pain and being thankful  
 that I am helped with opportunity to dispose of  
 my worldly goods and a property which I am  
 blessed with and am about to dispose after the  
 manner I form following first of all I would  
 to recommend my soul to Almighty God hope  
 ing when it is his will to take me out of time that  
 I shall go triumphant in his holy faith lastly  
 I wish my friends to bury my body in a Chris-  
 tian like manner and also to dispose of  
 my worldly estate & dispose of it in the following  
 manner

Item I give and bequeath unto my son James  
 Madison Sanderson the Land and plantation  
 that I bought of Thomas Sanderson Senr. Situate  
 bounded as follows beginning at the mouth of  
 a creek dividing my Land and the Land belonging  
 to William Coffey at Dowdays Bay thence up the  
 Creek to the head, binding said Coffey's Land thence  
 westwardly with the stream of the branch and by  
 a line of marked trees binding said Coffey's line to  
 the Back line to Sanderson's Land thence north  
 westwardly with his line to James White's Land  
 thence the same course with White's Land and  
 line to the land I bought of Matthew Gregory  
 & wife thence eastwardly with said line to the land  
 I bought of Thos. Payer esq. of Nelson Woodhouse  
 deceased thence the same course binding said  
 Land and a line to the main Road thence  
 northwardly with the main Road fifty Yards  
 thence eastwardly the same course of the line  
 to a mulberry Tree near the branch running  
 the line through the said bought of Jacob Sawdy  
 the above mentioned mulberry Tree thence to the ditch  
 that leads to the marsh where the plantation fence  
 joining the fence leading to the said marsh thence  
 with the ditch & Cut as it now runs to Dowdays  
 Creek thence eastwardly binding said Creek to the  
 Sound thence with the Sound to the straight thence  
 binding said Creek various courses southwardly to  
 Dowdays Bay thence westwardly binding the bay to  
 the first Station containing about seven or eight  
 Acres more or less also I give to my son James M.  
 Sanderson my Island called Kettle Cove and  
 long Point bounded by the various courses of the Sound  
 and a Creek and a bay containing about eighty  
 Acres be the same more or less and also I give  
 to my son J. M. Sanderson the one third of all  
 my Land and marsh and water that I own on  
 Narrows Island & Sheep Island and the short  
 water & cypress Islets situate in my plantation

with for the Narrows Island and Sheep Island  
 and the great Narrows and bay two Dollars Effort  
 since being paid to said Pattens four hundred Dollars  
 including the one third of my father's plantation  
 containing about eighty five Acres and the one third  
 of said Pattens to him and his heirs lawfully  
 the galle of his body and for the lack of such  
 I give the said above mentioned Land to my two  
 Sons Thomas John Woodhouse Sanderson and William  
 Dozier Sanderson to them and their heirs forever  
 Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas John  
 Woodhouse Sanderson the manner plantation and  
 Land and marsh where I now live bounded as  
 follows beginning at the mouth of a gut called  
 the Little Gut springing out of Dowdays Creek  
 and at Daniel Simons's bank thence westwardly  
 up the gut binding said Simons's line to the road  
 thence southwardly and westwardly various courses  
 by a line of marked trees binding said line  
 to the swamp and some course through the  
 swamp to a large pine being the south east  
 corner of the Land where M. Sum sold to Daniel  
 Simons thence northwardly the various courses  
 of the high ground binding said Simons's  
 line to Jesse Barnard's Land and a line  
 to three maples or white woods the north east  
 corner of Robert Nelson's plantation thence about  
 east by a line of marked trees binding said  
 Barnard's line to the main Road on the  
 lower swamp to the land I bought of  
 Mead Taylor and wife thence various  
 courses & fences being said to said  
 Taylor's Deeds for the boundary and by a line  
 of marked trees eastwardly with Daniel  
 Simons's line to a branch leading to the  
 marsh to old bridge thence northwardly with  
 said Simons's line to an old ditch as an  
 old pine stump or the edge of the ditch  
 at an old fence ~~thence~~ thence northwardly  
 with the ~~land~~ <sup>Deeds</sup> of Maddy Taylor's wife  
 through the end of the bay marsh to  
 the little narrow thence southwardly  
 the various courses of the narrow  
 over

and hamme Cove to Sawdays Creek thence  
up the creek to the first Station containing  
about five hundred and seventy acres  
of land & swamps & marsh also I give unto  
my son Thomas John Woodhouse the one third of  
all the land and swamps and dead water and  
Cyster rocks in my pattern holding narrow Island  
and Sheep Island the great narrow and the bay  
trees Island with the privilege of the said one third of  
my fishing priviledge and house Reference being  
had to the pattern for boundaries alongh Eight  
two acres be the same more or less to him and his  
heirs lawfully begotten of his body and for lack of  
such I give the above land and marsh and water  
to my two sons James M. Sanderson and  
William Dozie Sanderson to them and to their  
heirs forever.

I then I give and bequeath to my son Thomas John Wood-  
house all that piece or parcel of land I bought  
of Mathew Gregory & wife Reference being had  
to the Deed of said Gregory & wife for the boundaries  
containing about forty three acres and also all  
the piece of land I bought of Thomas Payne  
Executor of Milson Woodhouse Deed excepting what  
I have already given away and all that piece  
I bought of John Sawday and all that piece  
I bought of William Moten Esq. and all that  
piece I bought of Jacob Dowday excepting what  
I have given to my son James M. Sanderson  
containing about one Acre and ~~thirty~~ twenty five  
acres of Land more or less Reference  
being had to the Deed from the Bakers of the above  
land and also about twenty two acres of marsh  
or ground bought of Mathew Gregory & wife  
to him and his heirs lawfully begotten of his  
body and for lack of such I give the above  
mentioned lands & marsh to my two sons James  
Madison Sanderson and William Dozie  
Sanderson to them their heirs forever

above

I then I give and bequeath unto my son Nelson Dozie  
Sanderson my land and plantation selected and the  
Deed of Bond on the north by the land formerly  
belonged to Natham Dozie Esq. and on the south  
by the land now belongs to Madel Whitson and on  
the East and West by the swamps long and pattern  
long containing about three hundred acres including  
all the land adjoining the Hedge plantation that  
I own and also the one third of my land and marsh  
in narrow Island & Sheep Island and the one third  
of my pattern holding the great narrow and Bay  
Tree Island and the one third of all the fishing houses  
and priviledge thereto belonging. To contain about  
Eighty two acres more or less and I give him all  
my Swamp Land patterned by myself and Dan  
Lincoln Esq. adjoining the land formerly belonging to  
I Perry about one Acre and more or less to him  
and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body and  
for the lack of such I give the above mentioned  
Land to my two sons James M. and Thomas M.  
Sanderson to them and their heirs and if either of  
my two sons should die before they should come to  
lawful age the surviving one to have to have  
all the above land & priviledges.

I then I give and bequeath unto my Daughter  
Fremilia Thoroughgood one tract of land and plant-  
ation in Pasquotank County where on Northward  
Morris now being known by the name of the  
Crocker Hill tract bounded as follows Beginning  
at a Gum the south East corner of said tract  
and pattern and adjoining the land belonging to George  
Henry then a north west waddy boundary said  
Carvey line on mile to a corner gum standing  
in a branch near Joseph Morris Esq. and then  
westwardly with said Morris line and land to a  
poplar the corner of said pattern then a south  
Eastwardly with said pattern line to the corner  
thence Eastwardly to first Station containing three  
Acre and acres as stated in said pattern by  
to her and her heirs forever I give and bequeath  
to my daughter Fremilia Thoroughgood a negro  
woman an any which is now in her possession  
and all children of said negro woman any  
to her and her heirs forever and also I give  
my said daughter Fremilia two peaches Deed

and furniture which she now has and two  
Sally mehogany furniture belonged to her mother  
to her and her heirs forever and in her & family  
Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally  
my house and negro man called Mills  
and the one half of my schooner Con Stanton  
to her & to her heirs forever and two boys called Maltese  
Item I leave all the remainder of all my house  
hold & kitchen furniture and plantation furniture  
and all the remainder of my negroes and  
stock of all kinds and all the rest or remainder  
of my estate after my debts is paid to be equally  
divided between my three sons James and  
Thomas and William & Canderson & my wife  
Sally Canderson excepting my Banks Land  
which I give equally between my three boys or  
sons as above named and if either my three sons  
James, Thomas & William, or Canderson die before  
they have an heir of their body or come to lawfull  
age the surviving one shall their parts with-  
out any reserved matters.

I do authorize my Executor hereafter mentioned to  
convey by a deed of bargain and sale to Thomas  
Sambles for a tract of Land in Pasquotank  
County where John a Jordan Dec<sup>d</sup> formerly  
lived upon condition of Thomas Sambles  
paying to my said Executor the sum of two  
Thousand Dollars with lawfull int from the  
first day of November 1819 until paid and  
the said money to be applied to the paying  
of a Debt I owe to the estate or heirs of Milledge  
Goyer Dec<sup>d</sup> and the remainder of said money  
I give unto my Grand Daughter Angeline -  
Thorough good to her & her heirs forever.

I do nominate constitute & appoint my friend Thomas Signer  
Exec. of this my last will & Testament foraking and  
disannulling all other wills or wills here before by  
me made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand & seal this the seventh day of Oct 1820

The Last will and Testament of Galt Storer Dec<sup>d</sup>  
was exhibited at May Term 1820. was written  
so badly that it could not be read  
correct enough to enter on Record, so original filed  
The Last will and Testament of Joseph Stuber Dec<sup>d</sup>  
was exhibited at February Term 1821.

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Stuber of the  
County of Currituck in the State of North Carolina  
being sick in body but of sound and disposing  
mind and memory befoe be God do this the seventh  
day of February in the Year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and sixteen Make  
public and declare this instrument of writing to be  
my last will and Testament in manner as followeth  
Item I leave the use of the house whereon I now live  
and as much of the Land after said Stuber takes  
his part off to my wife as she can use or own third  
of it during her life and I also give her one feather  
bed and furniture to her & her heirs forever also  
I leave to my wife Mary Stuber my Feather bed when  
I die during her life also I give my mill on Stone  
called Lube and my riding Chair to her and her  
heirs forever also I leave to my wife one negro Girl  
called Harriet and one negro boy called Jack  
during her life also give her one cow and calf  
at home and one cow in the woods or back  
Swamp also one sow and piggs first choice  
and all the poultry and one black table &  
Dozen Plates one set cups and saucers one iron  
pot one Tea Kettle & Dozen sitting Chair and  
one pair of Dog Iron one looking Glass and all  
the Bofat furniture to her and her heirs forever  
also one pair of fine tongs & one spoke to last her  
this Year. Item I give and bequeath to my  
son George Stuber and my son Peter
