 my last will & testament. I give and bequeath my soul to the Lord that gives it, and  
 as for my body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian manner at the  
 direction of my Executors, Nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall  
 receive the same again by the mighty power of God that gave it me, and touching  
 of such worldly Estate as I have been pleased the Lord to bless me with in this life  
 I am minded to give, as followeth. I give and bequeath it to my well loved wife to  
 raise my children upon to use it in devotion or as long as she is able to keep them &  
 bearing of her life or widowhood to my wife Mary Lee the daughter of Sam Greenman  
 to her high use and support of all my personal Estate within doors without leaving off  
 or the care of my friends William & George to be my whole sole Executor with my  
 wife Mary Lee, of this my last will & testament, I do disannull all other will or  
 Wills by me made, and do own this to be my last will & testament this 15 day  
 of October 1799 in presence of us.

 I dispose of as followeth.

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Bernard one negro man named Sarah and one  
 negro man named John his life term. The use of them, the use of one negro girl named  
 Ann, my beloved wife Margaret Bernard all my stock of cattle hogs  
 and sheep that belonged to the plantation whereon I now live to be her and heirs  
 forever, one black mare called Pearl & coat, one roan mare called Pigeon, one black horse  
 called Belonging to one man called Pigeon one case of flannel, and all my household  
 linen, one wheel (except one iron pot) and all my house hold furniture except  
 one feather bed and four new four feather beds, two pewter plates and one  
 tin can to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my brother Robert Bernard one negro man named Sarah and one  
 negro man named John his life term. The use of them, the use of one negro girl named  
 Ann, my brother Robert Bernard all my stock of cattle hogs and sheep that belonged to the

I do nominate and appoint my brother Robert Bernard Executor of this my last will and  
 testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto  
 set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of December 1798.
