to be Equally Divided among said three Children for their
Clothing & Education, Untill the Oldest arrives to the age of
sixteen years & then the profits to be Divided between the
other two, till y^e second comes to the age of sixteen then
it other to have the whole profits till she arrives to the age
of sixteen But should either of the above named Children die
under the of sixteen then the other or others to have the benefit
of the above Land & Improvements as above. —
Then I give & bequeath to my Daughter Ester, Whether my
Best Bed, Bedstead & Furniture & three horse spun Gowns,
for ever Likewise 5 Sitting Chairs. —
Then I give & bequeath to my John Greig the Land & Improve-
ments whereon I now live to him & his heirs for ever,
but should he die without Lawfull Issue Begotten of his body
then the said Land to be Equally among my three Daughters
Ester Lydia & Julia & their heirs for ever or the survivors
of them & their heirs for ever —
Then the Remainder of my Estate within & without Doors
to be sold & the sum arriving from the sale to be apply'd to the
Clothing & Educating my three Children John Lydia &
Julia ~~with profits~~ in the same manner as the profits of the
Land but should either of them Die then the other or others
to have the benefit of sale, I do nominate constitute &
appoint my Trusty friend Edward Bunnell my whole Exe

 First I give unto my wife two Cows & Calves and two yowes and lambs
 and one feather bed and furniture and one small post and tubb
 as long as she lives my widow
 Then I give unto my daughter Frances Miller two Cows and Calves
 and two yowes and lambs and one feather bed and furniture
 Then I give unto my daughter Ephraim Miller one tract of land
 whereon I now live containing 90 acres more or less to her
 and heirs for ever likewise I give unto my daughter Ephraim Miller
 two Cows and Calves two yowes and lambs and one feather bed and
 furniture and one yow and one duck oven and one horn caldron
 Then I give to my grandson William quickly one buffer
 Then I give to my daughter Edith Cozome feather bed and furniture
 and one post - and after paying all my debts I leave
 all within doors and without doors to be Equally divided between
 my two Daughters Frances Miller and Edith Cozome and do
 hereby apoint Aaron Bright my executor this my last
 will and Testament given under my hand and seal
 this 2 day of October 1792
