The Last Will and Testament of John Bowdy Esqur
Exhibited and proved at Stovemarri Court 1824

In the name of God amen.

I John Bowdy Esqur of the State of South Carolina and County of Barnwell, being in a reasonable state of Health and of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, First of all my will is that after my decease all my just debt be paid by my executor hereafter named,

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Bowdy one dollar to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Grigg one cow and yearling and one heifer to her and her heirs

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Spence Bowdy the piece of Land I bought of John Heath to him and his heirs

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Willoughby Bowdy the piece or parcel of Land that fell to me by the death of my brother Caleb Bowdy to him and his heirs

Item I give ~~and bequeath~~ unto my wife Kizia Bowdy two beds and furniture to her and her heirs

Item I give unto my son Spence Bowdy one bed & furniture

Item I give unto my son Willoughby Bowdy one bed & furniture

Item I give unto my daughter Selah Bowdy one bed furniture

Item I give unto my wife Kizia Bowdy, son Willoughby Bowdy, daughter Clarkey Bowdy and daughter Selah

Bowdy all my cattle what I have not given away to be equally divided amongst them all my will and desire is that if either of my three children Willoughby, Clarkey or Selah should die without lawful heir or heirs begotten of their body the part of said cattle

to go and descend to the surviving ones

Item I give unto my wife Kizia Bowdy son Willoughby Bowdy, daughter Clarkey Bowdy, daughter Selah Bowdy my two mares to them and their heirs

I item I give unto my wife Kizia Bowdy son Willoughby Bowdy daughter Clarkey Bowdy & daughter Selah Bowdy all my hope to them and their heirs

Item I give unto my son Willoughby Bowdy my concert to him and his heirs

Item I give unto my wife Kizia Bowdy son Willoughby Bowdy, Clarkey Bowdy & Selah Bowdy all my property not already given away both in this world and without to be equally divided amongst them, to them and their heirs

Item Lastly I nominate and appoint Thomas Poplar Esqur my Executor to this my last will and testament - In witness whereof I the said John Bowdy Esqur have hereunto set my hand and seal this 17 day of April 1824

The Last Will and Testament of Willoughby White deceased Exhibited and proved Feby 1825

In the name of God amen I Willoughby White being of sound and disposing mind and memory blessed be God so makes and ordains this instrument of writing to be my last will and testament in manner and form following

Item I give and bequeath to Leon Ball and the land and marsh called Crow Island with all the stock thereon and one piece of Land and marsh on Moose Island near Bellowses Bay to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my grand son William White, the South part of the land and plantation wherein I now live and the North half of my apple orchard and one half of my garden nursery bounded as follows beginning at a stone on the

bound side a corner between the aforesaid White and the heirs of Daniel Burton deceased the westerly along the bound side to a chimney post on the bank head turned westerly to an oak a corner between the aforesaid White and the heirs of Moses caps deceased thence southerly and easterly various courses of the said White line to the first station containing sixty five acres more or less to him and his heirs forever and if he die without heir lawfully begotten of his body to his sister Harriet Robertson and her heirs Item I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Burton the remainder part of my land and plantation wherein I now live with south half of my apple orchard and one half of my gerupon nursery to contain sixty five acres more or less to her and her heirs and if she die without heir lawfully begotten of her body to her sister Dizyff Burton and her heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to my Grand son Dennis Tatton forty acres of Land and marsh an swamp joining Longrock Bay and it at the same Robertson line with the building being part of the Land and plantation formerly belonging to Adam Robertson deceased to him and his heirs forever Item the remainder of the land formerly belonging to Adam Robertson deceased joining to John Bratbell that I have not given to Dennis Tatton I leave to be sold by my executors for six months credit and the money to be divided between Zephah Berry and Dizyff Burton and their heirs Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary White fifty acres of land and one cart

Item I give and bequeath to my two Grand sons Dennis Ballance and Lewis Ballance one piece of Land on the head of Falls Creek after the death of my wife Mary White to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever Item I give and bequeath to Edmund Douglass son of Obenay Douglass three acres of Land on the west side of the Rode that was gregorys Land at Falls Creek to him and his heirs forever

Item All the remainder of my property which is not already given away I leave to be equally divided into

four parts one fourth part I give to the heirs of Daniel Burton deceased and their heirs one fourth part I give to Lewis Ballance and his heirs one fourth part I leave to my wife Mary White during her natural life and after her death to be divided between the heirs of Daniel Burton deceased Lewis Ballance and his and Caleb Tatton and his heirs Lastly I hereby constitute ordain and appoint my trusty friends Thos M as Poyner Geno Caleb Etheridge and Cudchill whole and sole executors to this my last will and testament as witness my hand and seal this 18th day of September 1824

The Last Will and Testament of Edward Burnell

In the name of God amen - I Edward Burnell being of sound mind but weak in body and knowing that it is appointed for all to die make this my last will and testament commanding for all to die make this my last will and testament commanding all others - I request that my body be decently buried and any body to mingle with its mother dust committing my soul to him that gave it

Item I give unto my son William Burnell all the notes which I hold against him as his part of my estate; also my wearing cloths I hold against him as his part of my estate; also my wearing cloths Item I give unto beloved son Isaac Burnell one bed and furniture one cow and calf first choice two year old & Lamb the tract or pieces of Land on which I live bounded on the east by the road and on the west by the creek or all my land on the west side of the road where I live, I also give unto Isaac the Bush House with the conditions that Isaac shall let William Burnell have the use of the house as long as the house shall live

Item I give unto my beloved son John Burnell the tract of Land on the east side of the road one cow and calf one bed & furniture two years, also give him my negro called Miles, one shot gun first choice
